She said that even if we approve the recommended policies now, they will not be in effect until the beginning of the 2023-24 school year. The first review will be this month. second review next month, and then approval could be in June effective in the next school year. Dr. Paddyfote, Project-Based Employee, confirmed this.</p> <p>Mrs. McInerney asked if these policies are brand new, and if this is the first time they are seeing them. Dr. Paddyfote confirmed and said, “This would be a brand new policy that would have replaced it. You don't really have a non-discrimination policy. You have an equal educational opportunity... We're going to recycle the number because it makes sense to reuse your numbers, and eventually maybe we can get rid of those decimal points and have a nice, clean series.”</p> <p>Mrs. Rella explained to new BOE member, Mrs. Herring, that there is a policy and a regulation. The regulation is how we implement the policy. The administrative regulation is for information only. If the Superintendent needs to tweak it or change it, she can and then notify the BOE.</p> <p>Ms. Hollander said she has been working closely with the State Department of Education, and one of the things that the BOE may want to consider: currently we must have parents' signatures on a note for it to count as an excused absence. We could consider an email from a verified email address without a signature as valid.</p>
