Upcoming meeting dates were shared with the school council, as well as duties and responsibilities of serving on the school council.

Dr. Rush stated that central office personnel visited the school on 8/17 and the visit went very well. We received a proficient rating. Teachers were on task; the school was organized and clean.

Dr. Rush shared the ribbon cutting event that occurred at LRPS on 10/25. The ceremony went very well. There were visitors from the central office, state representatives, and military personnel in attendance.

The school board members also visited LRPS on 10/31. They stopped by some kindergarten classrooms and were able to view some excellent teaching and learning.

Dr. Rush discussed some fundraising events:

- Step it Up brought in close to \$17,000, and all this money was used for the down payment of the digital marquee outside of the school.
- Turkey Trot fundraiser was set up to offset the cost of the remaining funds owed on the digital sign. Our goal was to raise 10,800. We raised almost \$6,000.
- To offset the remaining cost of the sign, LRPS is going to offer an advertising fundraiser using the sign. We will post student birthdays and businesses for a cost. Our counselor will reach out to businesses to see if they are interested in advertising.
