
Although the season wasn't successful as we had hoped, we did spoil the Winter Haven Blue Devils Homecoming with a 7-7 tie.










## Lake Wales Highlander Band

The Lake Wales Highlander Band was the only Class B band in the state to make straight superiors at state contest. It was the 19th year the band has received this rating.




#### Seniors -
