#### **Register to Vote**

If you are registered to vote in the general election, then you are registered to vote in the school election. If you are unsure if you are registered to vote, please call the Board of Elections Office for the county in which you reside.

#### **Absentee Ballots**

### **Annual School Budget Vote and Board Elections**

The Hadley-Luzerne Central School District Board of Education is proposing a budget of \$23,293,895 for the 2023-24 school year resulting in an estimated 0.9% increase in the tax levy, which is well below the tax levy cap of 3.75%. This represents an overall budgetto-budget increase of \$763,873 or 3.39%, which will be offset by a 4% increase in NYS Aid and use of the district's fund balance.

Each year, our school district strives to provide an academic program that supports a safe, positive, and rewarding learning experience. As we developed the 2023-24 budget, our goals were to maintain programs, maximize taxpayer dollars, and keep budget increases to a minimum. We are pleased to say we have been able to achieve these goals.

For the 2023-24 school year, the district will continue to provide physical and mental health services to students on campus through Hudson Headwaters and Northern Rivers Family of Services. Having these two providers on site allows students to attend school consistently and receive the services they need while learning and playing alongside their peers.

The district plans to hire a second school psychologist next year to help the Committee on Special Education identify students with disabilities and support their individual education plans. This individual will also help implement social emotional learning K-12.

NYS Education Law allows school districts to conduct one \$100,000 "capital outlay" project per year, which does not require special approval from voters. Capital outlay projects are reimbursed in the form of revenue (based on the district's NYS Building Aid ratio) the following fiscal year. HLCSD took advantage of this opportunity for the past two years to complete health and safety related projects including floor replacement in the senior wing of the Junior/Senior High School and roof repair over the main entrance of the Junior/Senior High School.

After careful consideration of the budget for next year, the district will not undertake a capital outlay project in 2023-24. Instead, the Board of Education Facilities Committee will review and prioritize the recommendations contained in the Building Condition Survey, which NYS requires school districts to complete every five years, to plan what areas should be considered for a future capital project.

We are proud of the educational opportunities we are able to provide our students while being fiscally responsible to the taxpayers. We appreciate the support and partnership of the PTSA, Booster Club, and residents who entrust us with their children and their investment in our facilities.

### 2023-24 Proposed School Budget

RESOLVED, to adopt the annual budget for the 2023-2024 school year in the amount of \$23,293,895 and to authorize the requisite portion therefore to be raised by taxation on the taxable property of the district.

#### **Proposition 1**

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education is hereby authorized to acquire three (3) 65-passenger school buses at a maximum estimated cost not to exceed \$580,668, which is estimated to be the maximum cost thereof, and to expend such sum for such purpose and to levy the necessary tax therefore taking into account state aid received, to be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education and in anticipation of the collection of such tax, issue bonds and notes of the district at one time or from time to time in the principal amount not to exceed \$580,668 and to levy a tax to pay the interest on such obligations when due.

#### Election of One School Board Member

Vote to elect one (1) member to the Board of Education, at large, to a three (3) year term, commencing on July 1, 2023 and expiring on June 30, 2026. The incumbent is Eddie Joe Moulton, whose term expires on June 30, 2023.

# Why Are We Voting for Library Trustees?

In June 2019, voters approved the Hadley Luzerne Public Library's request to change its charter from a "municipal library" – funded only by the towns of Hadley and Lake Luzerne – to a "school district library" that would expand the tax base to the same geographical area as the Hadley-Luzerne Central School District. The vote was 241 votes for and 199 against.

"School District Public Libraries" are totally independent of the school district. They are corporate entities chartered by the Board of Regents and registered by the Commissioner of Education. NYS Education Law provides a means for public and association libraries to access voters in the community in order to levy taxes and to use tax collection mechanisms. Tax money collected for the library is kept separate from the school district budget, and any increases to the library budget would face approval by popular vote of school district constituents. The library board of trustees are elected to three-year terms rather than appointed.
