Our Goals for Student Achievement

- In 2025-2026, students taking the Milestones ELA assessments will meet or exceed the 3% achievement improvement targets.
- In 2025-2026, students taking the Milestones Math assessments will meet or exceed the 3% achievement improvement targets.
- In 2025-2026, the FCSS will provide academic, emotional, social, and behavioral support to students to encourage engagement in their education, build academic resilience in students, and promote good physical, mental, and emotional health.
- In 2025-2026 the FCSS will provide structured support, mentoring, and professional learning to those enrolled in our Fannin Educator Development Program and potential leadership candidates.

School Goal(s) & Focus Areas(s)

- Grades K-2 will show an increase in students scoring "at or above benchmark" by 10%, and grades 3-5 will increase achievement scores in Reading on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.
- In grades K-5, 80% of students will achieve end-of-year grade level expectations or increase by at least one stage on IKAN and GloSS assessments from Fall 2025 to Spring 2026. Students in grades 3-5 will increase achievement in math on the Georgia Milestones by 3%.
- For the 2025-26 school year, EFES will increase opportunities to serve the whole child.
- Increase growth for special education students in reading and math by 3% on Georgia Milestones EOGs.

Teachers, Parents, and Students Together for Success

East Fannin Staff

East Fannin Elementary School will work with students and their families to support students' success in math, reading, and climate and culture. Some of our key connections with families will be to:

- Provide frequent home to school connections in each grade level that give students an opportunity to practice what is being learned in class. (i.e. math facts, high frequency words, Google Classroom, web based programs, and class or grade level newsletters).
- Provide individualized interventions and whole child support through SEL initiatives for students that are not performing at expectation in academic areas and/or behavior.
- Plan and host after school events that provide students, parents, and teachers an opportunity to have fun, learn, and build community, which supports our goal of having our students at school every day.
- Provide training for parents to help build their comfort with grade level content and strategies to support learning at home.

At Home

East Fannin Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in math, reading, and climate and culture. Families may have other ideas to add to this list which includes:

- Attend workshops or events at least one time during the year to help my child succeed in school.
- Use resources provided by East Fannin at least 2 times per week to support math skills.
- Read with my child each night.
- Send in notes or doctor's excuses every time my child is absent and make sure that he/she is in school every day possible.
- Support positive behavior by checking Class Dojo and reinforcing positive behavior expectations.

East Fannin Students

East Fannin students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in math, reading, and attendance. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Be responsible for using both print and digital math resources to reinforce skills learned at school.
- Be responsible in taking reading materials to and from school to read with your parent and/or family members.
- Attend school daily, be on time, and be ready to participate in class. If you are tardy be sure and check in at the office
 for a slip
- Complete classwork and homework daily and ask for help when needed.
- Take communication to and from school and be responsible for giving it to a parent/guardian.
