And He called the twelve to Himself, and began to send them out two by two, and gave them power over unclean spirits. He commanded them to take nothing for the journey except a staff—no bag, no bread, no copper in their money belts—but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics (Mark 6:7-9).

PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Blessed Novena to Our Lady of Mt Carmel, everyone! (Today, Sunday, July 11, is Day Five!) In Hebrew, "Carmel" is a conjunction of two words: "kerem" (garden, vineyard) and "el" (God). So, our Heavenly Mother has two titles that could be added to her litanies: "Our Lady of the Garden, pray for us!" and "Our Lady of the Vineyard, pray for us!" A vineyard is where the raw materials for wine and getting drunk in the sober intoxication of the Spirit come from! So, we are back to the theme and reality of Pentecost: **Come, Holy Spirit!!! I encourage you to try to set aside this Thursday or Friday evening to come to the 7:00 p.m. Mass in order to celebrate with us the Solemnity of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.** She is the spouse of the Holy Spirit, so I anticipate lots of outpourings of the Lord Spirit, especially on those two evenings during and after Mass. **As usual, there will be healing prayer ministry available both evenings.**

Here is a little story about the Brown Scapular: At St. Jude's Church off of Boston Avenue in Downtown San Diego, Mother Teresa came to meet some AIDS patients. It was June of 1996. At some point during the meeting, she gave them Brown Scapulars, and they then returned to their AIDS home. A few days later, Jesús, one of the patients, felt close to death and remembered Mother Teresa talking about the Brown Scapular and the Blessed Virgin Mary. He asked one of the nurses if she could put it back on him (they had taken it off when they were washing him). She said yes, but then forgot to do it. In the middle of the night she remembered and came into the darkened room. Without turning on any lights, while she was placing the Scapular around his neck, Jesús suddenly called out, "Turn out the lights! It's too bright!" The nurse saw a light and became frightened. She ran out of the room looking for some co-workers, to see if she was going crazy or to find out if they, too, could see a light. As they entered, the whole room lit up momentarily and Jesús died. Nine people witnessed this.

The story is told that the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock (an English Carmelite priest and brother) in the 13th century, and that she gave him a brown-colored article of clothing called a "scapular" (so called because it hangs over the scapula or shoulder bones) as an abiding sign of her special love and motherly protection. It is also said that she gave him—and **all** who devoutly wear the Brown Scapular!—this promise: "This shall be to you and to all Carmelites a privilege, that those who die clothed in this shall not suffer eternal fire; and if wearing it when they die, they shall be saved." By wearing it, or even better, being enrolled in it, a person is saying "Yes" to Mary. "Yes, I want you to be my Heavenly Mother. Yes, I believe that when I was baptized I became a member of God's family, and that I have not only a Heavenly Father, God, but also a Heavenly, Blessed Mother, you, God's greatest creature. I also believe that, as part of this Family, I have older brothers and sisters, the angels and saints. I believe in and want your special love for me; I want your motherly protection. I, for my part, will try to live up to the demands of the Christian life in imitation of you and your Son, Jesus Christ. By clothing me with this physical sign of your motherly love, I trust that you will also help clothe me with your virtues of humility, faith, hope, and charity for Jesus, of prayer and self-forgetfulness, of friendship with and obedience to God and His Church, and with your other virtues."

It is also good to keep in mind that the Brown Scapular is not a magical charm that will get you into Heaven automatically. It is meant to be used as an act of faith, not as an act of superstition. Superstition is trying to get God to do what you want. Religion—or Faith—is trying to get yourself to do what God wants. Along with Jesus and Mary, your Blessed Mother (with St Joseph's help!), working through the Scapular will help you to do God's will, so that you can already taste—in this life!—the joy of really being a son or daughter in God's Family. **In gratitude, remember to kiss your Scapular and pray the "Hail, Mary" each day. —Fr. Thomas Koller, OCD**

IN HONOR OF OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

All are welcome to join us each evening at 7:00 p.m. (on Saturday and Sunday, July 10 and 11, at 5:00 p.m.) from now through July 16, for the celebration of Mass in honor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, the patroness of the Carmelite order. On Friday, July 16, the Feast Day, we will enroll all those present who have **not been previously enrolled** in the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (once enrolled, you are enrolled forever, and any replacement scapulars are automatically blessed. To prepare for this feast, we have been praying a Novena (see box below) in her honor after each Mass—it will continue **through this Thursday, July 15.**

O Most beautiful Flower of Mount Carmel, Fruitful Vine, Splendor of Heaven, Blessed Mother of Christ, Immaculate Virgin, we praise and honor you as our Queen and Mother.

Help us to persevere in constant prayer for the needs of our world and share with you in the work of redemption. Be with us, Holy Virgin, guide us on our way, as we journey together in faith, hope, and love to your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Mary, Queen Beauty of Carmel, pray for us and obtain our requests. Amen.

DEVOTION TO OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

The Carmelites consider the Blessed Virgin Mary—the person who was closest in life to Jesus Christ—to be a perfect model of the interior life of prayer and contemplation, to which Carmelites aspire, as well as a model of virtue. She is seen as the one who points Christians most surely to Christ. As she says to the servants at the wedding at Cana, "Do whatever He tells you." Fr. Gabriel of St. Mary Magdalene de Pazzi, OCD, a revered authority on Carmelite spirituality, wrote what devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel truly means:



A special call to the interior life, which is preeminently a Marian life. Our Lady wants us to resemble her not only in our outward vesture but, far more, in heart and spirit. If we gaze into Mary's soul, we shall see that grace in her has flowered into a spiritual life of incalculable wealth: a life of recollection, prayer, uninterrupted oblation to God, continual contact, and intimate union with Him. Mary's soul is a sanctuary reserved for God alone, where no human creature has ever left its trace, where love and zeal for the glory of God and the salvation of mankind reign supreme. Those who want to live their devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel to the full must follow Mary into the depths of her interior life. Carmel is the symbol of the contemplative life, the life wholly dedicated to the quest for God, wholly orientated towards intimacy with God; the one who has best realized this highest of ideals is Our Lady herself, 'Queen and Splendor of Carmel'".

In today's First Reading (Amos 7:12 –15), Amos tells Amaziah, "I was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores." He looked after sheep and punched holes in fruit for a living! Now he was being called to prophesy. In Mark's Gospel (6:7–13), the apostles are sent out two by two to begin their ministry. In the Second Reading (Ephesians 1:3–14), Paul takes it further, telling the Ephesians, "In Him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things." Like St. Paul, Mother Teresa challenged us to do ordinary things with extraordinary love. Basketball coach Jim Valvano said, "Every single day, in every walk of life, ordinary people do extraordinary things." Sometimes we see extraordinary vocations, such as the child prodigy musician. But usually those whom God chooses to call are reluctant participants who either run from the call or ignore it. He calls ALL of us! How are YOU being called to be extraordinary this day?

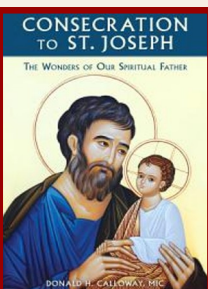

CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH

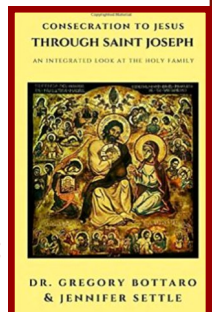
FOR THOSE NOT YET CONSECRATED: The next consecration will be on **Friday, July 16**, the Feast of Our Lady of Mt Carmel. Until then, those wishing to prepare themselves to be consecrated to St. Joseph should meet at their choice of **12 Noon or 6:00 p.m.** We will meet both times each Wednesday through July 14. The book we use to prepare is **Consecration to St. Joseph**, available for purchase in the office for \$15 each.

FOR THOSE ALREADY CONSECRATED TO ST. JOSEPH: If you have already made a Consecration to St. Joseph, we recommend **Consecration to Jesus through St. Joseph: An Integrated Look at the Holy Family.** This book looks at the Holy Family through the lens of St. John Paul II's *Theology of the Body*. Dr. Gregory Bottaro and Jennifer Settle have prepared this **devotional journal exercise** to bring into focus the spiritual (virtues) as well as the psychological (characteristics) realities of being human, reflecting on the full humanity of St. Joseph, Our Lady, and Jesus. This is a **private**, simple, and humble devotion, which began Friday, July 2, and **continues for the next 44 days until the Consecration on Sunday, August 15**, the Feast of the Assumption.

Jesus Sent Them Out Two by Two



Did you ever wonder why Jesus sent the Twelve out two by two? Why not in threes? Why not in groups of four? Perhaps it is just the most practical configuration. Recall that in last week's Gospel (Mark 6:1 -6), Jesus was not accepted in His own town and was astonished by the lack of faith that He found there. The disciples would be too new in their faith to know how to deal with that kind of rejection. With three, you always end up two against one. With a pair, the two could support each other emotionally and spiritually and lift each other up in prayer.

When traveling, having a companion was much safer than being on one's own, and if there were treacherous spots in the journey, they could help each other through. If you were begging for lodging, two might be able to get in, while a larger group might not be so fortunate. The Gospel gives no indication of who the partners were, but presumably they were sent in combinations that made each pair the strongest proclaimers of Christ. They were able to drive off many demons and cure illnesses.
