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## Kindergarten

This week kindergarten worked with numbers 6-9. We use Unifix cubes and counters to help us find the combinations to make the number that is the focus for the day. We talked about which number is greater, less, or equal, which can be a little tricky to remember sometimes, so the unifix cubes help to see the differences.

Students are still working on patterns. They make different patterns with the Unifix cubes and tell me what kind of pattern they made and what comes next in their pattern.



With each letter we learn, students learn a chant to go with it and how to show the letter in sign language. So far we have learned letters- a, m, d, t, o, c, and g.

The first week of November is conferences. I will send out a message on Dojo about times and days available and a paper copy for those that do not use Dojo.

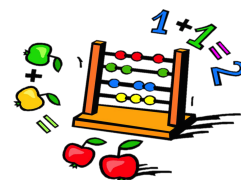
## First and Second Grade Explorers

Congratulations to both 5th and 6th grade who took their Chapter 2 math tests last week and did a fantastic job! This week we start up chapter 3 which sees the 5th grade learning how to add and subtract decimals and the 6th grade learning about negative numbers and absolute value.

In ELA, 5th grade is finishing up their unit on Early American cultures and 6th grade is finishing their mythology unit by examining common mythological traits in three separate Greek myths with a 5 paragraph informational essay.

Students are now working on a state project in social studies where they examine unique traits of different states and then will present their state to the class.

When learning more about respecting not just other people, places, and things, but also respecting ourselves, students in all grades filled out leaves with personal statements related to why they should "BELEAF" (believe) in themselves, including written responses such as: **"I can do hard things!"**



We also delved deeper and learned about the connections between bullying and respect, and how kind words and actions, such as giving a friend a compliment, and using good manners (for example, saying "please" and "thank you") is respectful and helps our hearts to feel good. However, critical words and harmful actions can make a person feel disrespected, which makes our hearts hurt.
