



JET JAZZ AND CONCERT BAND



Laughing in the face of danger senior, Chris Fairall says, "Algebra II is a really fun class, even though I don't know what I'm doing."







Chowing down, junior Amanda Marlow says, "U.S. History with Mr. Davis is great! He makes it more interesting. You feel like you're part of history."






Stars on the Rise
