WHAT'S HAPPENING

K/1 Mrs. Hemon

There was a flurry of activity in the K/1 classroom during December. We worked on lots of projects and crafts for our families, as well as read lots of stories.

The Leopard group has learned 13 high frequency words and all the letters of the alphabet. We're cycling back and reviewing the letters again, starting to use them to build consonant-vowel-consonant words. In Math, we focused on counting, reading, and writing the numbers 0 to 20. Those teen numbers are tricky for some! We also started listening to stories about joining groups and writing addition sentences that match.

The Butterfly group focused on words with the digraphs sh, th, and ch, as well as the trigraph thr. These sounds can be really tricky for some of the students. In Math, we are working on addition to 20, learning many different strategies for adding two or three numbers. We have some students who are now adding fluently using mental math, and some students who still need to use manipulatives to solve the problems.

Grade 3 Ms. Gourlay The month of December is over and it is on to the New Year! The kids are still working extremely hard and the month of December was a fun one. The kids are still working on honing in on their multiplication and division skills. They have been doing their states and capitals in social studies and studying magnets in science. They have been having a lot of fun in the snow during recess as well!

Grade 2- Mrs. Ricker

December was a busy month full of learning, holiday fun, and crafts! In Language Arts, we continued reading fairy tales and fables. We will soon be reading about the weather in both Science and Language Arts.

In Math, we continued practicing different mental math strategies for both addition and subtraction. We are now learning how to add two 2-digit numbers together and what it means to regroup. Second graders are loving math and are excited to be adding large numbers!

In Social Studies, we finished up our unit on Economics. Students learned about the difference between wants and needs, spending and saving money, types of resources, how goods are priced, and how to earn money.

Grades 4/5 - Ms. Wonkka

Since 2022 is now gone, we can take a look back and reflect on what the month of December taught us in 4th and 5th grade. We finished with all the ins and outs of multiplication and just briefly began division (which we will continue with in January). We covered many reading and language arts skills including visualization, point of view, elements of drama, and synthesizing topic knowledge while focusing on the module essential question of "What does it take to meet a challenge?". We explored many aspects of the hydrosphere in Science such as the distribution of water on Earth, the effects of the hydrosphere, and human impacts. Finally, in NH History, we studied some cultural aspects of NH's first people--the Abenaki.

Hello, Jr. High School students and families! I hope you all had a wonderful holiday break. The students were able to complete some Social Studies projects before the break, and new assignments have been started. Grades 6 and 7 have been working on researching and creating a slide show, or poster on a province or territory in Canada, along with a city located in their assigned area. Grade eight students are researching the history of Jamestown and Roanoke and will use the research to create a project.

For our ELA classes, the students have been reading and analyzing poetry. Their knowledge of the figurative language used has increased so that they can recognize similes, metaphors, onomatopoeia, and personification. They have also learned about how rhyme scheme is used.

Math & Science- Mr. Kennedy

Junior High Math

Students are learning how to figure the end result of either adding, subtracting, dividing, or multiplying integers. Sue Bergman, visiting teacher, showed the students a video on when you multiply or divide integers. Same sign-POSITIVE Different sign-NEGATIVE! Now after vacation we are reviewing the Order of Operations. Please Excuse My Dear Aunt Sally. Does that sound familiar to some of you? Ask someone in Mr. K's math class and see if they know the answer.

Junior High Science

Science I- What do you know about light and sound energy? We learned in class about different terms such as frequency, wavelength, etc. The students created their own presentation about their knowledge. What are they learning now since we have come back from holiday break? Do you know about atomic structure? Do you know that atomic number of an element shows information more than just how many protons the element has?

Science II- Students are learning about the physical and chemical properties of matter. They recently did a lab before vacation involving created a foil boat to show density. The students had to create a foil boat to hold as many pennies before it sunk. Now students are learning about how matter changes from one state to another.

8th graders are leaning about mollusks. What are mollusks? Mollusks are invertebrates that are slugs, snails, mussels and octopus. Do you know any other invertebrates. Now the students are reviewing their knowledge of the three important cycles found in an ecosystem. Do you know that those three cycles are? If you guessed water, carbon and nitrogen, you guessed correctly!

Special Education- Mr. Covill

With the month of December fading into memory, we say goodbye to 2022. In Pre-K to first grade I have continued to work on letter and number recognition and rote counting. We have also progressed to writing our names. In the second grade we have mastered glued sounds such as -ang, -ing, -ong, and -ung, along with new trick words. In the third grade classroom I have been working on new forms of multiplication and division. With fourth graders I have been working on sight words, as well as CCV words. In middle school we worked on really interesting new analogies. In math we have worked on how positive and negative numbers interact in mathematics. Let's make 2023 a great year!
