1. Int	roduction (1 paragraph)
	Introduce <i>The Institute</i> (title and author)
	Briefly summarize what the novel is about
	End with a thesis statement : What is your overall opinion of the book? (e.g., its effectiveness, emotional impact, what King is trying to say about society)
2. Plo	t Summary (1-2 paragraphs)
	Summarize the major events of the story.
	Focus on key turning points : How does the story start, what major conflicts arise, and how does it end?

☐ Avoid retelling every single event — summarize meaningfully.
3. Character Analysis (2-3 paragraphs)
☐ Choose two major characters (example: Luke Ellis and Mrs. Sigsby).
☐ For each character:
☐ Describe their personalities.
Explain their motivations and how they change (or don't) over time.
☐ Give specific examples from the book.
4. Themes and Symbols (2-3 paragraphs)
☐ Identify at least two central themes of the novel (examples: abuse of power, resilience, loss of innocence).
☐ Explain how Stephen King develops these themes through the characters, setting, and plot.
☐ Identify and briefly explain at least one important symbol in the novel (example: the Institute building itself).
5. Personal Reflection (1-2 paragraphs)
☐ What emotions did this novel make you feel?
☐ What lessons, if any, did you take away from the story?
☐ Did you find it suspenseful, scary, sad, hopeful? Explain with examples.
☐ Would you recommend this book to others? Why or why not?

Requirements for Full Credit:

> Address **all five sections** listed above.

- ➤ Include at least **three direct quotes** from the novel with proper MLA citations.
- > Stay on topic and organize your writing clearly.
- > Edit carefully for grammar, punctuation, and spelling.
- > Show **original thinking** don't just summarize; *analyze and reflect*.
