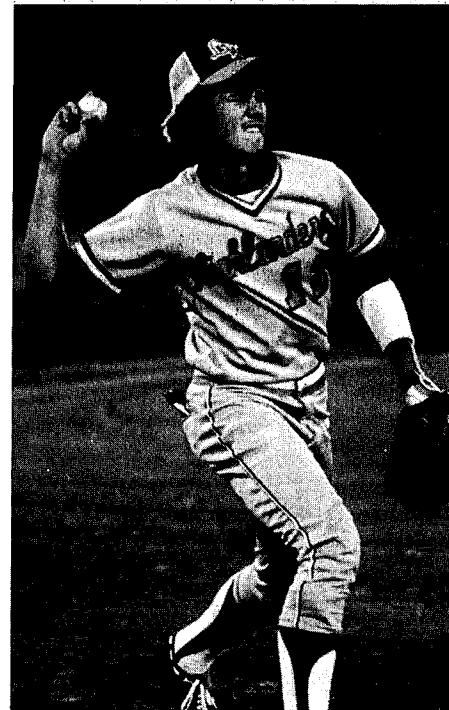


Players Possess Ability

The season concluded after losing to the team mothers in a mother-son softball game.

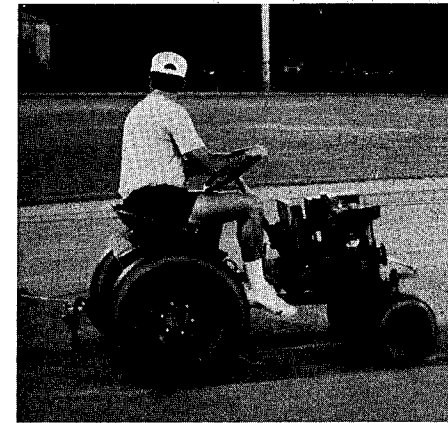

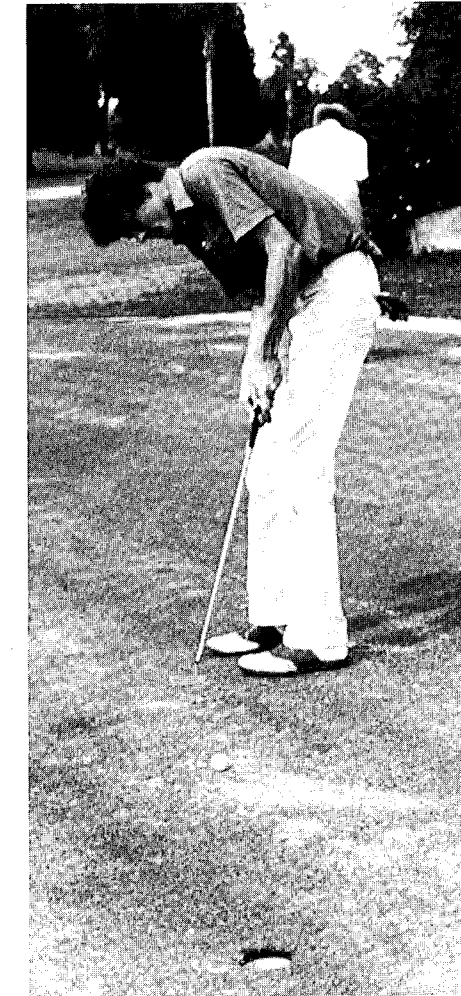
LW Places in Top Five in District

The team had only two seniors: Gretchen Bates and Jennifer Borders. The remainder of the team consisted of all underclassmen.

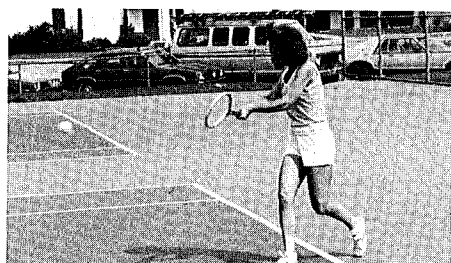

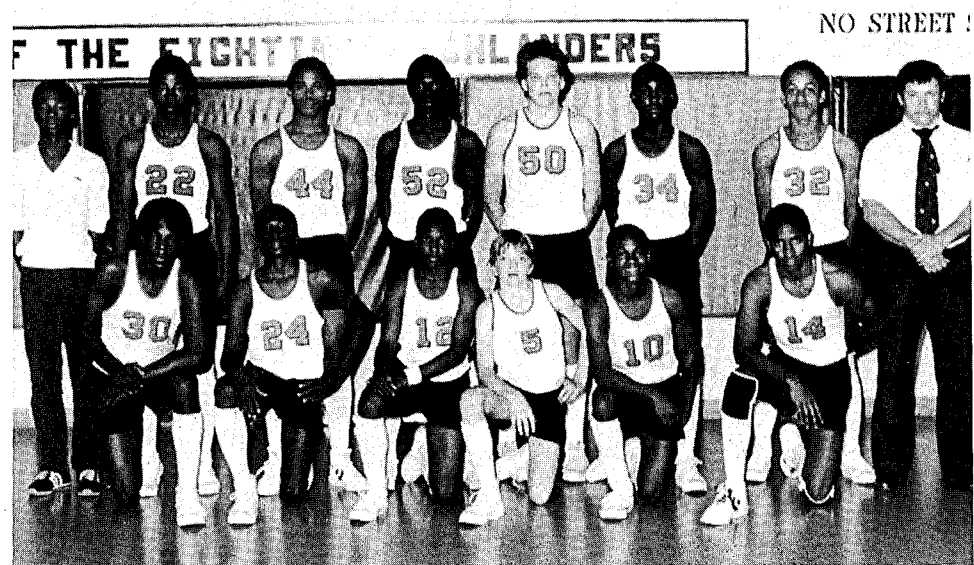
Freshmen Play Tough

Best Season in Years

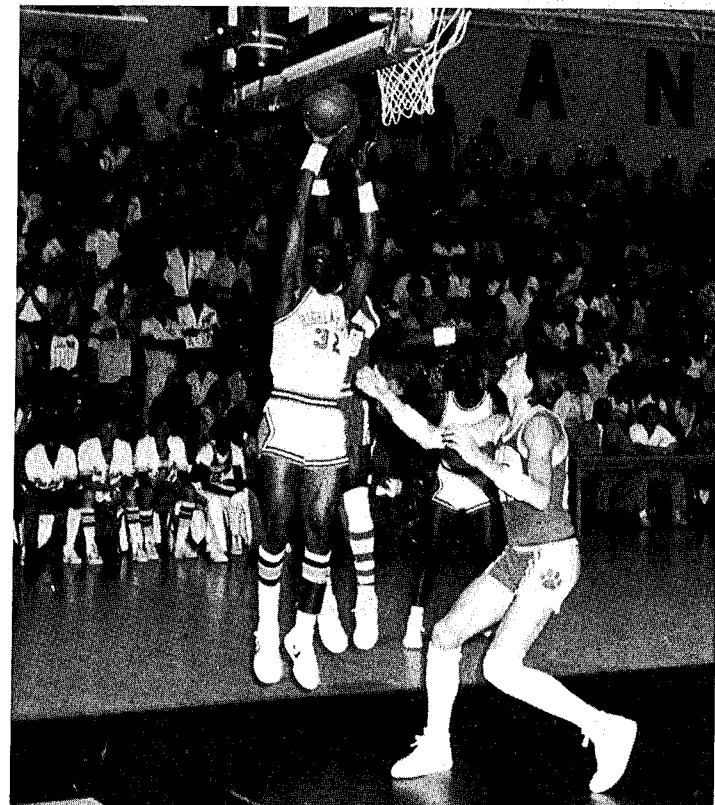

Highlander Football Team Makes History!!!

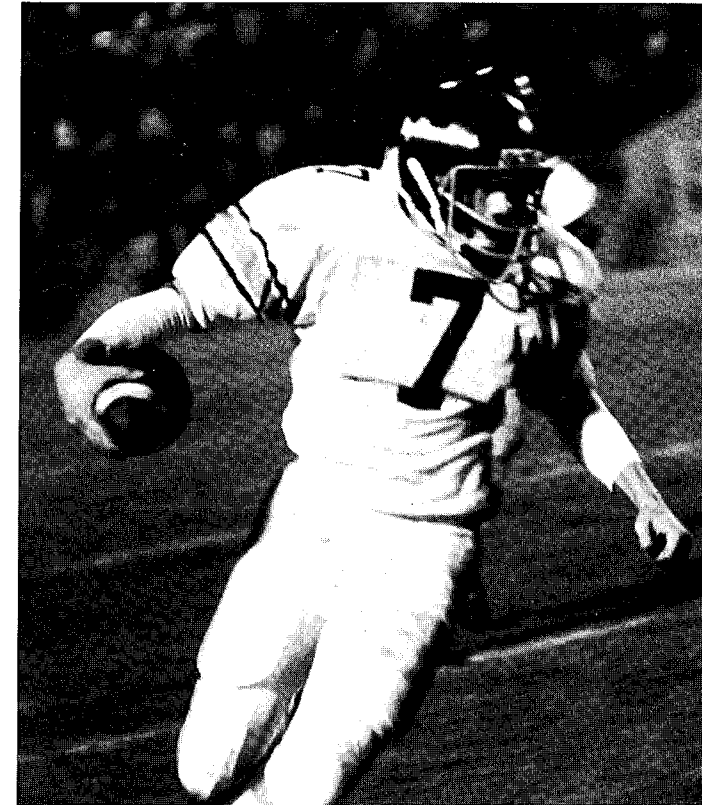
The talented football team of 1981 began preparing for a long season in the spring. Later in the summer the team practiced twice a day and Coach Howze led strenuous weightlifting workouts.

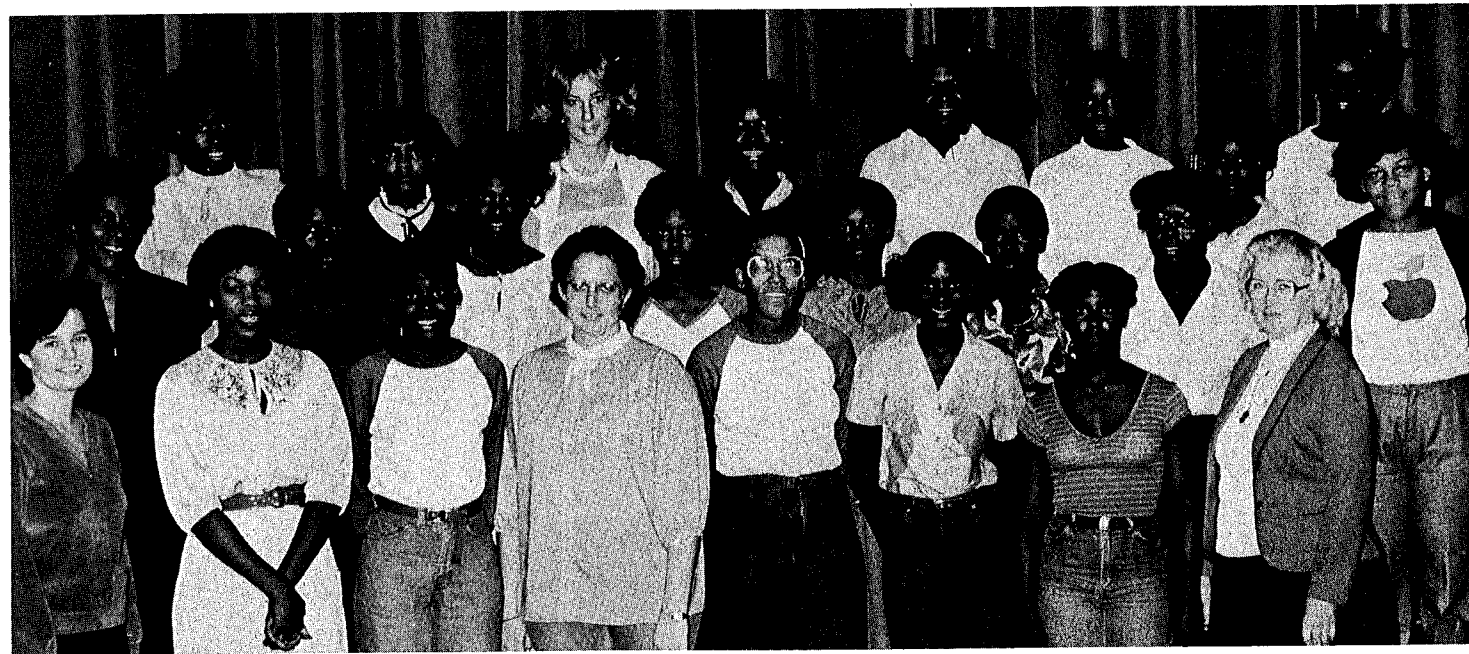

Chosen for Prom Queen and King were Candi Owen and Andy Nelson. They danced to "The Best of Times" on the dance floor at Studio 54.



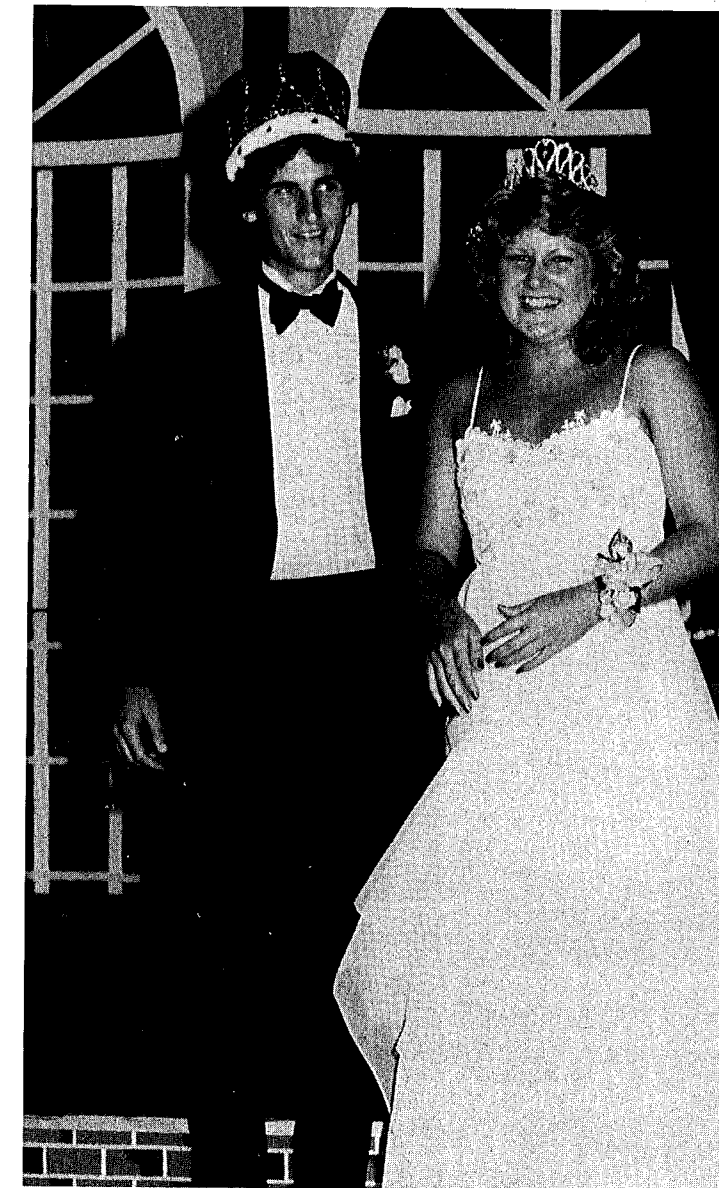

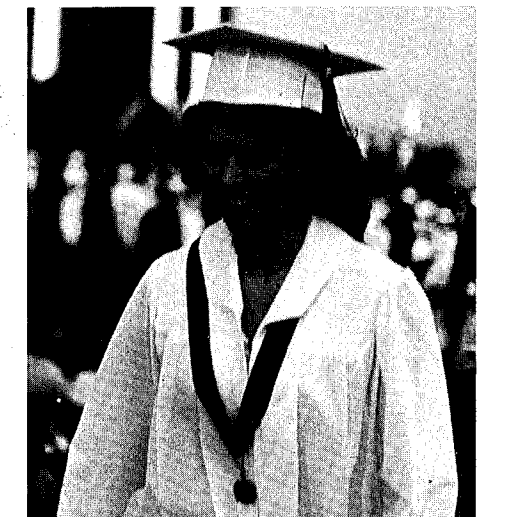
One Step Closer to Graduation

As the Seniors left the theater, smiles spread on many faces as they realized they were one step closer to the final procession in graduation.

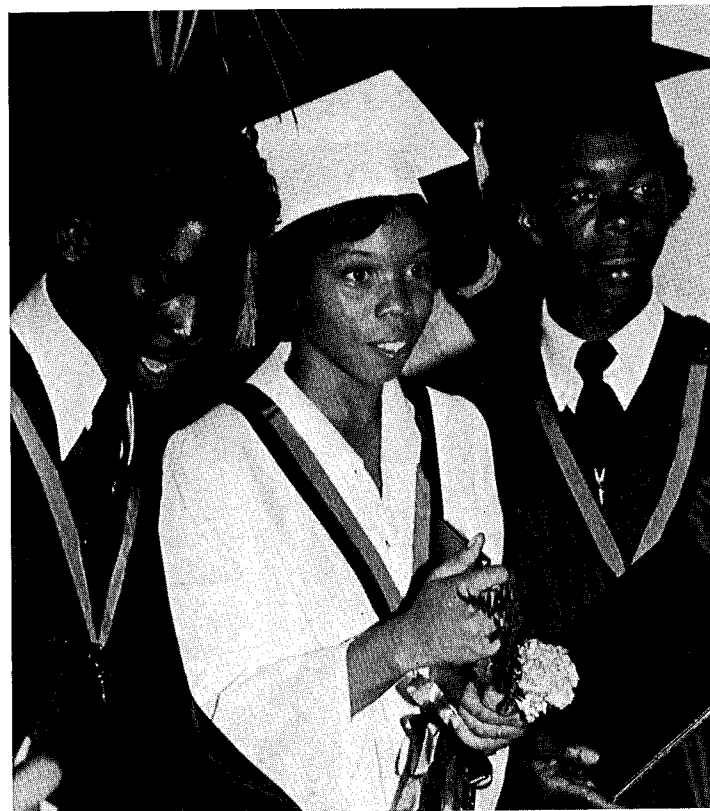
