CRYSTAL CITY AT INGRAM WARRIOR FIELD, 7 P.M. AUG. 30, 2024

The Warriors kick off the 2024 football season tonight, facing an opponent with a similar storyline — trying to get back to the UIL playoffs. Like Ingram Tom Moore, Crystal City hasn't been to the playoffs since 2018, but they're facing a tall task tonight against the Warriors. Senior quarterback **Kye Hightower** is leading the way, who rushed for 1,327 yards in 2023 and scored 16 touchdowns. Hightower was named Dave Campbell's preseason player of the year for District 13 in the 3A. Last season, Hightower threw for 812 yards, with six TDS, completing 41% of his passes. However, to get back to the playoffs, Warriors Coach **Tate DeMasco** (fourth season) will look to a core of returning players to help Ingram in the playoff pursuit.

The returners include:

- Sophomore kicker Christian Carranza converted 31 of 35 extra points in 2023 and hit two field goals, including a season-long 30-yard strike.
- Bowden Zipp, a junior wide receiver and defensive back, was the second-leading receiver in 2023, with 224 receiving yards and two touchdowns. Zipp had 51 tackles, two interceptions and a fumble recovery at defensive back.

- Maxon Driggers, a senior receiver, caught nine passes last season, with one touchdown.
- Defensive lineman Alex Duckworth returns after leading the Warriors with 68 tackles in 2023.
- Defensive and offensive lineman Chris Alva had three sacks and five tackles for a loss last season. Alva forced five fumbles, recovering two. He will play a vital role on the offensive line.
- Linebacker Andres Boites led the Warriors with five sacks and a teamhigh nine tackles for losses in 2023.
- Peyton Middleton returns after 51 tackles, recovering three fumbles and scoring the Warriors lone defensive touchdown and safety. Middleton played in six games last season.
- The Warriors will depend on defensive returners Will Symm and Daniel Kelly. Symm finished his first season with the Warriors with 27 tackles in nine games, while Kelly had 26 tackles.
- Senior Angus McLaughlin could contribute on offense and defense for the Warriors. McLaughlin will play running back and linebacker.
- Junior wide receiver Cadyn Reed caught four passes for 69 yards last season.
- First-year varsity player Logan Spalding could see some time at quarter-back. He directed two scoring drives against Junction in a scrimmage.
 Ingram faces a vigorous preseason schedule before opening district play against Randolph on Oct. 7 at Warrior Stadium. The Warriors face a challenging three-game stretch in September at Comfort, Blanco and Brady before heading into the Randolph showdown.
