1. Mrs. Ashely Wright

- b. Ashley Wright, anchored for life coordinator, gave a presentation on Anchored for life obligations. Mrs. Wright informed the audience that there were two leaders, Dr. Gordon and she, along with 8 student members from 4<sup>th</sup> grade (2 students) and 5<sup>th</sup> grade (6 students).
- c. Mrs. Wright discussed service projects that anchored for life has recently contributed to. One of the service projects included collecting toiletries items from MAES students and donating them to a homeless program.
- d. Mrs. Wright also discussed and presented pictures of the members of Anchored for life performing positive behavior lessons for students who could not attend PBIS celebration. The lessons included what it takes to be a noble knight.
- e. Anchored for life meetings are held once every other month. Call meetings can be held quickly when needed upon request.

- f. Anchored for life members provide tours for new students. During the tour, new students are given a welcome kit that includes a backpack, parent book (Spanish and English language), journal, ruler and pencils, folder and crayons. Mrs. Wright informed the audience that during the tours the students can make a connection with the new students by having informal conversations.
- g. Mrs. Wright then proceeded to discuss the different types of kits that anchored for life presents...
  - i. Moving kit- this kit is for students who are moving out of state, mostly includes military students. The kit includes a teddy named "Cuzhe" because he cares. Cuz- he has several patches on his exterior. The students who received these kits are informed to attach a memory to each patch. This kit also includes informational cards that the student can give to their friends to stay in contact. A QR code, guidebook, journal and a coin are also found in this kit.
  - ii. Deployment kit- This kit includes a teddy, hat, goggles, and a scarf, in which students can play dress up with the items. Postcards and a journal are also included in this box. Students can write how they feel throughout the deployment and share it with their parents upon their return.
  - iii. Returning kit- This kit includes the same items as the deployment kit, however, this is for students who have parents returning from a deployment.
  - iv. Divorce kit- This kit is for students whose parents are going through a divorce or recently divorced. This kit is normally presented by Mr. Sebastin and Mrs. Melnick.
  - v. Grief kit- This kit is for students who have lost a loved one such as a parent, grandparent, cat, dog, or someone significant. This kit is normally presented by Mr. Sebastin and Mrs. Melnick.
  - vi. The benefits of Anchored for life are displayed throughout the school. It helps students with communication, responsibility, self-expression, friendship building and confidence.

a. Mrs. Corner sent out an email asking for staff member input on MAPS colors and mascot. She expressed her excitement about the transition and assured the audience it would be great.

- 7. Report to the Principal- school news- upcoming events
  - a. Dr. Harrell informed the audience that the MAES and MAPS are still one family and there will be collaboration events held for staff members throughout the upcoming year. Dr. Harrell informed everyone that when everything is finalized, they will send out information through Dojo to parents so that they are informed about MAPS.
