Do not staple I printed the application as two sheets (please do not duplex print the application) I enclosed an OFFICIAL copy of my high school transcript and senior year schedule I enclosed a copy of my parent('s) latest IRS Form 1040 through the adjusted gross income line or other OFFICIAL document (W-2/W-4 not acceptable); SSN is blacked out I enclosed three Letters of Recommendation (from Community or Business Leaders, Non-Profit organization staff member, Teachers, Counselors, Instructors, etc.) I enclosed the Tuskegee Airmen Essay (typed, double spaced, not to exceed one page, with one inch margins) I enclosed a Personal Essay (typed, double spaced, not to exceed two pages; with one inch margins; ensure you state why financial aid is essential) I enclosed a list of Extracurricular and Community Activities I retained a copy of my completed application package for my records I signed the application. Also, my parent(s) or quardian signed the application The appropriate school official (e.g. guidance counselor) signed the application I placed my application in a secure folder for mailing or turn in to the Chapter. Questions concerning the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation (TASF) Scholarship

Q: What type of scholarship is this?

A: This is a need-based scholarship. Financial need is a key criteria for the award of the scholarship.

Q: Who provides this scholarship?

A: The Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation located in Los Angeles, CA.

Q: Why is the scholarship provided?

A: To assist students with a financial need; and to honor the Tuskegee Airmen for their contributions to the war effort and to their country.

Q: Who do I work with locally concerning the scholarship application?

A: Maj Gen Joseph A. McNeil Chapter, Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. (Attn: Roy Swygert or Willie Jones)

Q: Where can students obtain an application?

A: Applications may be obtained from high school guidance counselors, Chapter members and from the Education/Scholarship Chairs of participating organizations

Q: Do I or my parents have to be Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. members to apply?

A: No, you do not have to be a member of Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. or The Chapter.

Q: Who is eligible to apply for the scholarships?

A: All high school seniors, graduating in 2026, are eligible to apply.

Q: What is the selection criteria?

A: Each application package is scored using the following criteria.

Academic Achievement (3.0 or higher GPA; standardized test scores: SAT or ACT)
Relative Financial Need

Essays: Personal and Tuskegee Airmen and three Letters of Recommendation Extracurricular Activities/Community Involvement

Q: What documents are included in the student's application package?

A: The student will receive a package containing the following items. Chapter Cover letter, Scholarship Questions and Answers MGJAMCTAI TASF Scholarship Checklist, TASF Scholarship Application (Form 62)

Q: When are the applications due to the Chapter?

Questions concerning the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation (TASF) Scholarship

Q: What should I do if I cannot mail my application?

A: Please contact Roy Swygert to arrange pick up of your application package (see bottom of next page for contact information)

Q: Why do you require me to turn in the application earlier than the date on the Form 62?

A: The Chapter reviews each application thoroughly. The review takes time. After the review, we will contact you to revise items in your package. Therefore, we need the additional time to ensure your application package is as good as it can possibly be.

Q: How can I ensure my application package is complete?

A: Include all items identified on the MGJAMCTAI Application Package Completion Checklist.

Q: How should students return the completed application package to the Chapter?

A: The student may mail the application to the address in the header on the first page. Please place your application package in a manila folder. This will ensure it looks its best. If the student received the application from a Chapter member, the student may return the application to the Chapter member. The student may arrange for pickup w/the Chapter's Scholarship Chairman.

Q: What happens after I submit my application?

A: The application is scored by the Chapter. The Chapter's top five applications are sent to the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation (TASF). The TASF receives scholarship applications from over 50 Tuskegee Airmen Chapters, nationwide. From these applications, the TASF selects 40 students to receive scholarships. This is a one-time scholarship.

Q: Will students be able to verify their applications have been received by the Chapter?

A: Yes, The Chapter will notify each applicant that the application has been received.

Q: How many scholarships will be awarded and what is the award amount?

A: The TASF will award 40 \$1500 scholarships, one \$5000 STEM schol. The Chapter may nominate 5 students for these scholarships.

Q: When will the recipients and non-recipients be notified?

A: Notification from the TASF Board of Directors will occur in early May. If your application is forwarded to the TASF for their consideration, you will be notified of your selection. You may also check on line at the following url. http://www.taisf.org/awardee.htm

GENERAL INFORMATION, INSTRUCTIONS AND REMINDER ITEMS

Background Information: Tuskegee Airmen, Incorporated is a unique organization dedicated to the preservation of the history of African American Veterans whose service during World War II demonstrated to America that the criteria for responsible citizenship are character and achievement rather than ethnic origin. Although incorporated in Washington, D.C., the organization consists of many chapters and a National Museum at Moton Field, AL. The Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation is located in Los Angeles, CA.

Each year the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation grants scholarship awards to deserving young men and women. Each year the number of available scholarship awards is directly related to income received from investments. Forty (40) awards of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) will be available in 2026. The \$1,500.00 awards are for one year only.

Eligibility Requirements: Applicants must be students of accredited high schools who have graduated or will graduate in the school year 2025 - 2026. Additionally, applying students must have a GPA of at least three points (3.0) on a four-point scale.

Application Procedure: Application forms and instructions may be obtained from high school guidance counselors or the nearest Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. Chapter. Completed applications must be returned to the specific address indicated on page 1 of this application or to the nearest Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. Chapter, on or before January 26, 2026. Each applicant must complete the entire application and provide all attachments listed on the bottom of the application form.

- The applicant must include a single page essay entitled "The Tuskegee Airmen" which reflects an overview of
 their history and how their experience has impacted the applicant personally. Essays must be typed, double-spaced
 with 1-inch margins on 8.5" x 11" paper. Please note, all attachments to application <u>must not</u> exceed 8.5" x
 11" in size.
- Additionally, Each applicant must submit a two (2) page personal essay containing: a biographical sketch, educational aspirations, career goals and an explanation of why financial aid is essential.
- To validate the financial status of the applicant, a copy of parent(s)' latest, preferably 2024, IRS Form 1040 through adjusted gross income line must be included in application package. Please do not send the entire return. If not required to file Form 1040, provide official alternate source document to verify income, such as statement from Public Social Services, Pensions or SSI (W-2 or W-4 not acceptable). SSN should be "blacked out".

Selection Procedure: Applications for scholarship assistance received by individual chapters of Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. are screened, verified as deemed appropriate, and competitively evaluated. Application files determined worthy of further consideration are forwarded to the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Selection Committee for National Competition. A scholarship selection committee, composed of several members from each Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. Region, evaluates individual applications. Using a scale of one hundred (100) points, the committee considers academic achievement, extracurricular and community activities, relative financial need, recommendations, and both essays to competitively rank applicants.

Notification Procedure: Finalists (selectees and non-selectees) will receive individual notices of final results from the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation Board of Directors.

Award Payment Certification: Scholarship awardees may enroll in the institution of their choice. Once the awardee has enrolled and started classes at their chosen institution, the student must send a verification of enrollment signed by the school registrar to the following address: Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation, P.O. Box 881780, Los Angeles, CA 90009. When the required verifications have been received, the award payments, made payable to the student, will be mailed to the address designated by the student.

Award Payment Limitation: Unless otherwise approved by the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Foundation, all scholarship awards must be paid within one year from date of selection notification.
