AL-951 2023-2024

In July 2023, AL-951 attended the Cadet Leadership Course (Camp Wolfpack) at the University of West Georgia and hosted our annual Summer Leadership, Drill, and Flight Commander schools. Additionally, we hosted Brig. Gen Cantwell and Command Chief Master Sergeant McKeen for a visit and conducted a Flag Detail for over 200 attendees at the Air Force JROTC (AFJROTC) Instructor Certification Course LDR Expo on Maxwell AFB, AL.

In August 2023, AL-951's Color Guard stayed busy. We presented the Colors at Autauga County School's (ACS) Professional Development Symposium. We also attended and presented the Colors during the 2nd Annual Learning Symposium hosted by Lt Gen Andrea Tullos, Air University Commander and President, at Maxwell AFB (MAFB). In addition, the team presented the Colors during multiple pep-rallies and football games at Marbury High School (MHS). Lastly, our unit hosted over 60 families for our annual Parent Night.

In September 2023, we executed our annual cookie dough fundraiser where our cadets raised over \$6,000 for our program. We also hosted cadets from South Panola High School's AFJROTC program. The visit was scheduled to collaborate and demonstrate a flag folding detail. Later that month, our Drill and Raider teams competed at the Stanhope Elmore High School Invitational. We finished 2nd place overall and brought home eleven trophies. Lastly, we performed during multiple pep-rallies, presented the Colors at multiple Prattville High School (PHS) and MHS football games, and marched in the PHS Homecoming Parade.

In October 2023, AL-951 volunteered to work the Autauga County Fair and also attended the Joint Leadership Development Conference (JLDC). In addition, we participated in Senior Night during PHS' football game. Lastly, our cadets decorated pumpkins that were submitted to the Parade of Pumpkins Contest in Prattville. The unit also received a surprise visit from Sergeant Batman.

In November 2023, our entire unit was busy.
