How to Read:

- > The "tree" on the left gives you options as to the depth of curriculum that you want to see.
- Begin by drilling on broad level skills or strands.
- > Drill to find the specific skills or standards that are the deterent to success.

Questions to Ask:

- > What skills gave my student the most difficulty?
- ➤ Have the scores improved over time ie from BM1 to BM2 to BM3 and so on?
- What are the individual student strengths and weaknesses that I can use for data conferences, parent conferences, IEP meetings or RTI?

Value: You can now look at a single student down to the skill level. Can look at multiple subjects at a time for a single student.

When to Use: During the year after a benchmark test or common assessment is given.
