American Government/Civics

Course Description

The government course provides students with a background in the philosophy, functions, and structure of the United States government. Students examine the philosophical foundations of the United States government and how that philosophy developed. Students also examine the structure and function of the United States government and its relationship to states and citizens.

Text

As a student of this course, you will be required to complete assigned reading and tasks from the text Magruder's *American Government*. These are available in class as a class set. Students should not take these home without authorization from me.

Technology

All students are issued a district-provided chrome book for instructional purposes, student engagement, and student learning. Chromebook use is at the direction and discretion of the classroom teacher. Also, it is expected that students will bring the Chromebook to class everyday. Students will not be allowed to use class chargers.

We will be using Canvas Learning Management System and it will serve as an out of class tool that will allow the students to remain in contact with the class and necessary material. Canvas will also serve as the repository for notes, handouts, study guides, and other materials that are a part of the course. Canvas can be accessed through the student chromebook.

Cell phones are strictly forbidden. If you have one out, even to check the time, I will confiscate it. Failure to give up a cell phone when directed will result in an office referral.
