5th and 6th grade: Wild or wonderful choice - surprise us with an ingredient that you really like or one that you think is a unique or fun choice

Staff/School (Ms Annie): Meat, sides, and drink

If you are unable to purchase items for our soup that is okay, your student will still get to enjoy the yummy soup! Unopened food items that are left over will be donated within our local community so someone else in our community can make their own Stone Soup!

Your students are working hard and giving their best effort! Next week report cards will go home. On these you will be able to see your child's beginning of the year and end of the year test scores.

At the halfway point in the school year your child should have around 30 AR points. Please be checking in with your child on their progress in this area. The more a child reads the better they do in all areas of their education. It is recommended that your child starts reading 30 minutes a night from now until the

end of the school year instead of our previous 20 minutes. This is especially true for any students who are behind grade level and/or not at 30 AR points yet.
