### School Administrator's Report – Stephanie Humphrey

- 1. The Book Blast was a success. We had 51.85% of participation and \$3,855 in donations. Every student in the school will receive at least four books. \$252 was raised for Stewartstown Community School.
- 2. Winter Carnival was a fun event.
- 3. During February, students had their mid-quarter check-in.
- 4. On February 19, Kiwanis hosted a cornhole tournament for students in grades 4-8. Brayden Woodburn and Josh Flagg were the champions and Jade Leighton and Corbyn Champagne-Clark were the runners-up.
- 5. Friday, February 16 was early release. Teachers went to Pittsburg to participate in Restorative Practice Professional Development.

## Superintendent's Report – Dr. Debra Taylor:

- 1. Dr. Taylor reported on the dates for the school district annual meetings in each district in SAU 7.
- North Point CTE Center Update: The five programs provide college credits that are available: Health Services – 24 credits; Education – 17 Credits; Hospitality and Culinary – 19 Credits; Automotive – 16 credits; and Computer Technology – 22 credits.
- 3. The Challenge of Budgeting and Funding our Schools: Across the state, school budgets and tax rates are on the rise. This is the result of a perfect storm of inflation and the

continued lack of funding from the State of New Hampshire. She pointed out that Vermont is #1 in funding education with 91% funding for local public education from state sources and New Hampshire ranks #50 with only 31% of funding from state sources.

4. Colebrook School District Building Project failed again this year.
