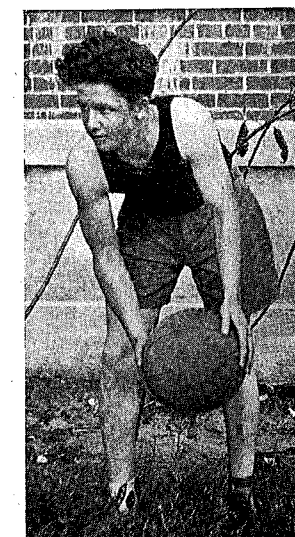

Forward

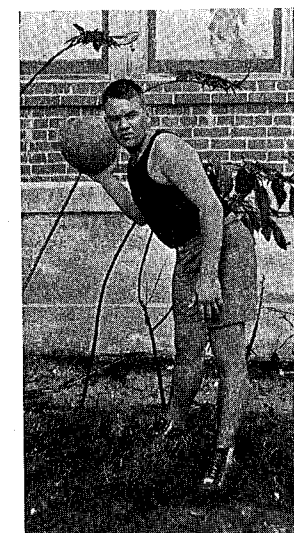
Perry's spectacular shots, from near mid-court, will not soon be forgotten. He was a valued man.

McLENDON—“FAT”

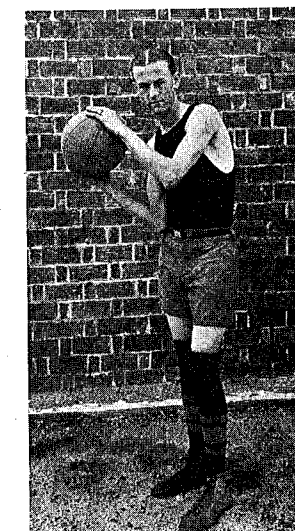
Guard

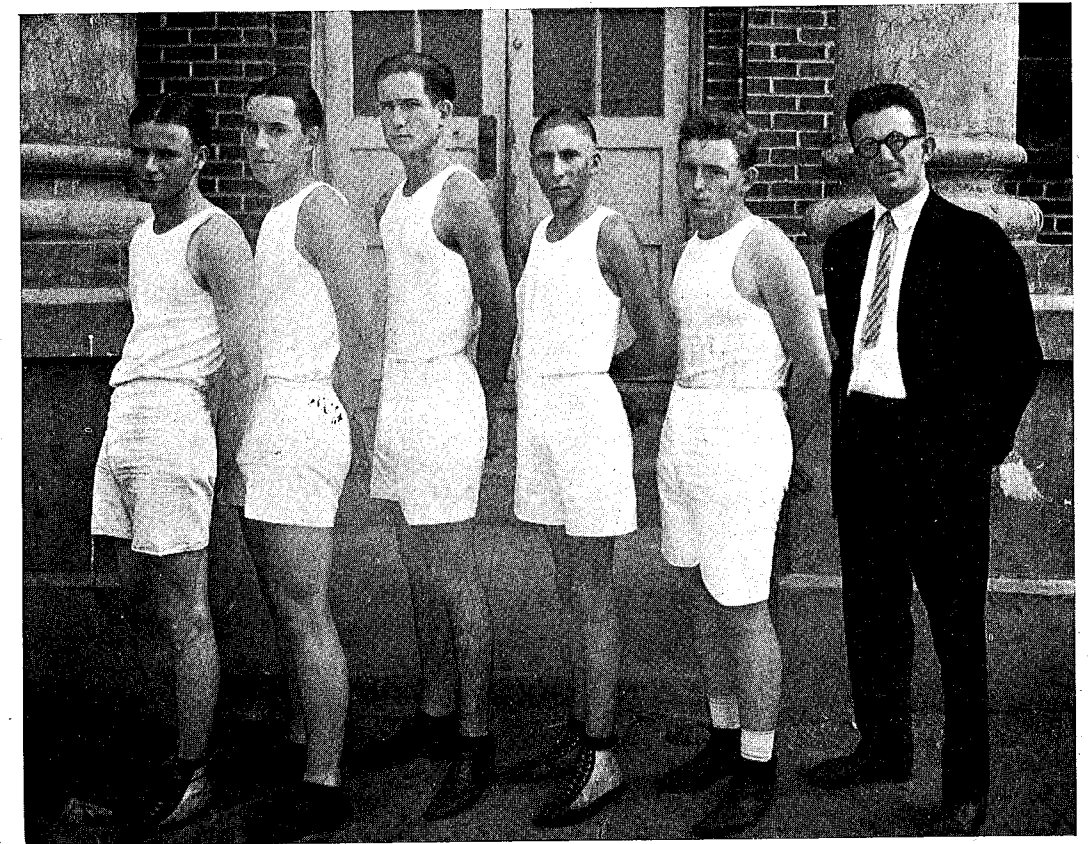
