Goals:

Collaborate and analyze all student data to drive instructional planning and identify students needing tiered support increasing the overall FAM-S percentage in the area of three-tiered instruction and intervention model from 38% to 50% by the end of the 2023-2024 school year. (Indicators: A2.05, A3.10, A4.01, A4.06, B3.03)

By June 2024, we will increase overall reading proficiency 4.2 percentage points (from 40.8% to 45%) as we promote college and career ready goals, and continue to work towards our target achievement percentile. The Comprehensive Plan identifies new instructional practices in reading across K-5 that will support this growth. This goal is linked to School Performance data. (Indicators: A2.05, A4.01, A4.06, B3.03)

By June 2025, we will increase overall math proficiency 8.3 percentage points (from 41.7% to 50%) as we promote college and career ready goals. The Comprehensive Plan identifies grade specific SMART goals in math across K-5. The goal is directly linked to the School Performance data and the FAM-S evaluation identifying math as an instructional focus. (Indicators: A2.05, A3.10, A4.01, B1.03, B3.03, C2.01)

In 2018-19 we successfully implemented data notebook shares across K-5. This year we will share student notebooks twice a year; mid-year and in May/June. During these student led notebook conferences, students are able to share with an adult their own goals, progress toward goals, as well as next steps to achieving the goals.

For the 2020-2021 school year, the students will continue to interact with their individual data notebooks and celebrate their progress. We will also be adding iStation tracking graphs to Grades 4-5. We will still share student notebooks with their special adult, but this will be done remotely through Meet or recorded presentations.

Routines and expectations are more important than ever for the 2020 academic year as teachers work closely on social distancing guidelines while still maintaining a feel of community within their classrooms.
