Preference will also be given to an applicant who has personal characteristics and traits similar to Jamie.

<u>Required Essay</u>: Each applicant must submit a solid essay of at least of 500 words explaining why you think you deserve this scholarship, what are your future goals and ambitions, what interests you about this field and what attributes you share with Jamie.
