Helpful Hints

-The term *guardian consonant* is used to identify the consonant following a vowel and to distinguish it from other consonants in a word.

-When a vowel is followed by a single guardian consonant (and nothing else), the vowel sound is short.

Examples: cat, man, tap

-If the vowel is short and no other consonant is heard with the ending /k/ sound in a single-syllable word, the spelling is -ck (e.g., *back*; *deck*).
