The next meeting of the Kings Chapel Elementary School Council will be held on November 17, 2022 in the media center at Kings Chapel Elementary at 4:30pm.

Meeting Summary:

A great deal of information was shared about KCES with council members and guests. Mr. Ray (principal) was able to give insight into what qualified KCES to be named a 2022 National Blue Ribbon School. He credited the staff, students, and parents for making this possible. Mr. Ray and Mrs. Shillcutt (assistant principal) will be traveling to Washington D.C. in November to officially receive the award. Mr. Parsons (assistant principal) shared information about the KCES PBIS initiative through a power point presentation and handouts. He discussed various expectations for students, how those are taught, how they are displayed through matrixes around the school, as well as how students are rewarded.

Mr. Ray went on to share information about the KCES Strategic Measures of Student Success. Using a handout, he highlighted specific scores and explained how canceled and reduced testing in 2020 impacted the chart given. The council specifically noted how 100% of KCES third grade students in spring of 2022 scored at "Developing Learner or Above" on the Georgia Milestones.

School council members asked for more information on how fundraising money was being allocated. It was shared that money was just used to purchase and install a new sign for KCES. The sign is used to share important information and dates with students and their families. KCES and PTO are also working to raise money to purchase and replace playground equipment. This is a long-term goal due to the high cost of equipment.
