The Fannin County Board of Education met in regular session with the following members present: Terry Bramlett, Chairperson; Bobby Bearden, Vice-Chairperson; Lewis DeWeese; Junior Farmer; and Emily Dunn. All members present.

Mark Henson, Superintendent, stated the SPLOST check received in February for the month of December was \$341,031.21. Mr. Henson recognized Susan Jackson for her hard work in the budget planning process and stated that the Board had reviewed several options for possible budget cuts for the FY10 school year during the Tuesday work session in an effort to trim approximately \$1.4 million from the upcoming budget. Because of the difficult financial times we are facing, we are in a position that requires us to make some hard choices. Keeping in mind that we want to maintain a quality instructional program for our students, avoid laying off personnel if at all possible, and continue to meet our responsibility to the Fannin County taxpayers, he recommended that the Board approve Option #2 on our Budget Reduction Options Spreadsheet. This option should save approximately \$1,465,000 and includes:

- A 2% reduction in the local supplement from 6% to 4% for all employees
- Reducing Central Office administrators' supplemental days by five (5)
- Reducing principals' supplemental days by five (5)
- Minimizing extended day system wide
- Eliminating summer school
- Streamlining the tutoring process
- Eliminating four(4) teaching positions through attrition and absorbing our current 5 half-time academic coaching positions
- Trimming maintenance and operations expenses
- Eliminating Thinkgate software
- Reducing the School Nutrition Program subsidy

• Purchasing three(3) fewer buses

Superintendent's Comments:

Mr. Henson showed board members what the center logo would look like for the new stadium.

Lewis DeWeese stated he looked forward in the future to watching other systems and seeing how they fare with the budget cuts. Mr. DeWeese stated he expected to see millage increases for other systems. Mr. DeWeese stated he thinks we have done a good job in Fannin planning for the budget cuts.

Terry Bramlett welcomed Mr. Farmer back. Mr Bramlett expressed appreciation to Mr. Henson and his staff for their exceptional work on the budget. Mr. Bramlett stated he was impressed with the job Steve Phillips and Danny Shinpaugh did with the Energy Education Program.
