- Curriculum Theme: The children picked up the different types and sizes of rocks around the campus. We observed and talked about what rocks we had-texture, size and color. The children handled the rocks carefully, modeled by the teachers.
- Conscious Discipline: The children had support with regulating feelings through singing and the Safe Place. Labeled feelings we expressed.
- Cultural Lifeways: Planted flowers and learned Keres words, with the help from Mrs.
 Kasero-Lente. Named pictures and used Keres at the table during meal times.
- **Goals / Milestones:** Children repeating and saying words. Having the children to be mobile walking and crawling.
- NP Saying 3 to 4 word sentences and doing things for herself (handwashing, pulling pants down/up).
- KL Saying words, recognizing and saying peer's names.
- MM Doing things for himself (handwashing, buckling self in chair), greeting and saying by to peers and families.
- JP Sitting on the potty and recognizing her peers.
- EW Knowing the routines of the day and transitioning from one activity to another.
- KL Walking on his own and sitting on the potty.
- MM III Adjusting to the routines and walking on his own.
- SA Pulling herself to stand and getting on the couches to sit.

• What did your classroom focus on throughout the year?

We focused on getting the children mobile (crawling and walking), repeating and saying words, and interacting with each other in gentle ways.

• What was the student's favorite curriculum theme?

The children liked the Seats theme (repeated theme for June. They learned how to snap the buckles (some snapped themselves in the chairs), and climbing in and out of the chairs.

What advice do you have children/parents to continue working on over the summer?

Have conversations with your child. Ask them questions and continue reading to them.

During our month of May, children learned about Insects: it was fun seeing your kids get excited looking for ants, finding lizards, and wondering about spiders. Children decorated bugs and learned some words: head, thorax, and abdomen. We hope to encourage their curiosity about insects throughout the month of June as more and more will show up.

Now, we are beginning the month of June! The weather is getting warmer and so are we...so we will study water to end our school year. We will be focusing our efforts toward helping our children have fun experiences and develop critical learning skills. We hope that you will pack a towel and keep an extra pair of clothes in your child's backpack: as children learn through hand-on experiences and they will get drenched.

Children will discover the importance of water and its many uses at home and at school, science and social studies will be explored as children investigate how water changes and how water helps people and the planet. Children will be encouraged to ask "why" questions: Why does water dry in the sun? Why is it hard to hold water? Why do we drink water? Etc...

As we close our school year, we will also take your children's interests in dinosaurs, camping, and baseball. They will learn more about "dinos" and make their own dinosaur name. With camping, teachers would like to have some centers in the classroom with "fishing" and picnic areas. Children can participate in playing a simple game of baseball, or T-ball, that will allow each child a turn to hit the ball and run the bases.

TIPS

Learning Highlight for Month of June into July

As DEC winds down the 2024-2025 Program year, we realize children will be home for a number of weeks before they return for Program Year 2025-2026 or transition to kindergarten.

How do families keep children learning and developing skills while at home?PLAY Is the answer! Don't forget YOU are still your child's most important playmate and YOU are their favorite TOY! Play promotes healthy development and critical thinking skills in children. It reinforces memory, helps with emotional and behavioral skills. Play increases language and literacy skills, play encourages independence and of course, play promotes physical fitness. HERE ARE A FEW PLAY ACTIVITIES/TOY IDEAS that are appropriate for each age level:

Infants - Floor play, tummy time, rolling balls, music, singing, dancing with infants. Simple water play. Play Peek-a-Boo. Use lots of language when playing.

Young Toddlers - Lots of active play, walking, running, climbing, use of stairs, throwing balls, push and pull toys. Use lots of language. Ask questions and give answers using simple phrases.

Older toddlers - Read stories together, ask child to do actions on page like "hop like a frog", or "stomp like a dinosaur", etc. Give the two step requests: "get your hat and put it on", etc. Preschoolers - Play is the work of children. Use lots of back-and-forth language exchanges. No matter what it looks like, when children PLAY, they LEARN. Have fun Learning!
