Attendance Policy

- Math 4 credits: Algebra, Geometry, & Adv Algebra are required
- Science 4 credits: Biology & Physical Science are required
- Lit 4 credits: Lit & Comp I & Lit & Comp II are required
- History 4 credits: American Gov, World History, US History, and Econ are required
- Pathway 3 credits: 3 courses in one area
- Personal Fitness & Health 1 credit
 TOTAL CREDITS REQUIRED: 24 Credits

Honor and Superior Honor Graduates

- Honor Graduates
 - 90 or better cumulative average
- Superior Honor Graduates
 - 95 or better cumulative average
 - Advanced Academic Pathway
 - Requirements
 - Earn four credits in one academic subject area
 - One of those credits must be an AP course or an academic DE course
 - Plus two credits of Foreign Language

Differences in GPAs

- HOPE GPA is calculated by using Core Academics plus
 Foreign Language
 - Math, Science, Social Studies,
 English and Foreign Language
 - Electives **DO NOT** count
 - CTAE course that count as a science credit is calculated into your HOPE GPA
 - Any extra points that are added by the school AP(5),
 De(4)Honors(3) are deducted (.5 added back for DE & AP)
 - See your HOPE GPA through your GAFutures account

- High School GPA is calculated using all types of credits
 - Math, Science, Social Studies,
 English and Foreign Language
 - Electives **DO** count
