RIPON UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT'S RESPONISBILITIES UNDER SECTION 504

Section 504:

A recipient (district) shall <u>conduct an</u>
<u>evaluation</u>... of **any person**, who, because of a
disability, **needs** or is **believed to need** special
education and related services <u>before</u> taking
any action with respect to the initial placement
and any subsequent significant change in
placement. (34 C.F.R Section 104.35)

IDEA and Section 504:

Schools are required to <u>locate</u>, <u>identify</u> and <u>evaluate</u> all children with disabilities from birth through age 21. (20 U.S.C. 1412(a)(3)) and 34.C.F.R. 104.32 and 33.

- Identify students with needs.
- Evaluate and determine eligibility.
- Provide access to appropriate supports and services if found eligible
- Provide a free, appropriate, public education (FAPE) to all qualified students with a disability.

INFORMATION REGARDING SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

Section 504 is an Act which prohibits discrimination against persons with a disability in any program receiving federal financial assistance. The Act defines a person with a disability as anyone who:

- Has mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities.
- Has a record of such an impairment, or;
- Is regarded as having such impairment.

THE EVALUATION PROCESS

The 504 team will evaluate the nature of the student's suspected disability.

- This may include a review of educational records and/or medical records; or if the child is suspected as having a disability under IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act), a full psycho-educational evaluation may be warranted.
- The evaluation must be sufficient to accurately and completely assess possible eligibility and service options.
- A final decision regarding eligibility will be made by the 504 team, which will consider whether or not the disabling condition substantially limits a major life activity, such as learning, walking, hearing, and concentrating.
- The results of the evaluation will be documented.
- If the student is found to be a qualified student with a disability, the District will develop and implement a 504 plan.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SUSPECT YOUR CHILD MAY NEED A 504 PLAN

- Schedule a Student Study Team Meeting and/or a 504 team meeting with your student's principal to consider developing a 504 Plan.
- Provide the Student Study Team or 504 team with any documentation you might have regarding your student's disability.
- The team members may begin an evaluation to determine if the student may qualify for a Section 504 plan.
