HCCA Dual Enrollment

Houston College & Career Academy is an extension of the programs of high schools in Houston County located at an off-campus center of Central Georgia Technical College.

Current Central Georgia Technical College Dual Enrollment Technical CTAE offerings at HCCA:

On Campus Dual Enrollment (College Courses Taken at Perry High School)

Juniors and Seniors who meet the admission requirements for Central Georgia Technical College can enroll in the following dual enrollment courses. Only CGTC courses are taught on the PHS campus:

- DE US History 2111 and DE US History 2112 (juniors)
- DE English 1101 and DE English 1102 (seniors)
- DE Economics 1101
- DE Sociology 1101
- DE Psychology 1101
- DE College Algebra 1111

Each course is taught on the Perry High School campus by PHS teachers. Students do not leave campus, and each course is one period.

College Campus Dual Enrollment

(Includes online courses)



- **Dual Enrollment (DE):**
 - Taught on college campuses or online according to college schedule
 - Students are released from high school up to 2 periods for each college class and required to make a year-long commitment to attending classes for those release periods
 - Students are responsible for admissions, transportation, and all communication with faculty during enrollment.
 - Course grades do not exceed 100 and will appear on the high school and college transcript.
 - College credit is awarded upon successful completion of the course.
 - Registration completed outside of Evening Advisement
 - PHS counselors do not have access to grades or are not able to communicate with professors

Grade Level Eligibility

- **Upcoming juniors and seniors are eligible to apply for Dual Enrollment**
- **Upcoming sophomores are only eligible to apply if they have a 1200 SAT score or a 26 ACT score. Sophomores are eligible for some Dual Enrolled CTAE courses taught at HCCA.**
- **Upcoming freshman are not eligible for Dual Enrollment**

Things to Consider

Most college level courses will give a student 1 credit per semester instead of $\frac{1}{2}$ unit of credit. This may affect a student's eligibility for sports if the DE course is not passed.



Things to Consider

For every off-campus **college** class a student takes, he/she will be released for **two periods** of the high school schedule. Lab courses will be released for **one period**.

Things to Consider

Failing a DE course can affect a student's Satisfactory Academic Progress and his/her ability to earn financial aid upon graduation.



Things to Consider



- Students may drop one DE course by the college deadline, receiving a Z on their transcript. After dropping a second course, the student will lose DE funding.

Things to Consider

DE will not pay for a class twice. If a student drops a class or fails a class, DE will not pay for the class to be taken again. The failing grade cannot be replaced on the high school transcript.

Things to Consider

DE will pay for up to 30 semester hours and 45 quarter hours. Once these hours are used, students will have to pay for any additional hours they take. This includes academic and Career Technical DE courses.

What class should my child take?



Students may take any approved English, math, science, social studies, foreign language or CTAE courses through dual enrollment.

What class should my child take?

We recommend completing graduation requirements first. Remember that there may be prerequisites for certain college classes.

Class Suggestions:

Juniors:

- American literature is required to graduate but English 1101 and sometimes 1102 are required to be completed before a student can register for American Literature at the college.
- US History 2111 or 2112
- College Algebra – Must have completed Algebra 2 before this course may be taken at the college.

Class Suggestions:

Seniors

- Economics (course number is college specific)
- English 1101/1102
- If you choose a science, you must take a lab section also
- Look at the required core courses for the college you plan to attend upon graduation. Match up their courses with what you can take at your DE college in order to use your funds more wisely.

What to do next?

- Apply to the college of your choice
- Fill out your GAfutures Dual Enrollment Funding Application for the 2025-2026 school year. Your classes will not be paid for until this form is filled out (gafutures.org).
- Once accepted, register for your classes with the college (not the high school). The college will email you more information.
- Once registered, bring a copy of your class schedule to your counselor as well as the high school checklist.

Deadline for all students to be accepted and registered for classes is May 9, 2025!

What to do next?

- **Evening Advisement will be March 3-5. Your student's advisor will send you an invitation. Please attend even if you plan on participating in Dual Enrollment.**
- **PHS counselors will meet with all interested students during PAWS on March 11.**
- **Parents are invited to come meet with a counselor on April 22 from 5:00-7:00. It will be drop-in on a first come, first served basis to discuss schedules and answer any questions. To attend, your student must have already been accepted into their DE college. This session is not mandatory.**
