KHS NAMES NEW HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Kingstree High School Blazer Nation formally introduced Coach Brandon Cantrell as the new head football coach for the Kingstree High School Blazers.

Coach Cantrell has a long track record of success, playing and coaching football in the state of South Carolina. Coach Cantrell played high school football at Berkeley High School, where they won the 1996 State Championship. Coach Cantrell also played collegiately at Clemson University and Appalachian State University. Coach Cantrell began his coaching career as an assistant football coach in Williamsburg County at Kingstree High School in 2006 and has coached at Lakewood High School, Manning High School, Timberland High School, Berkeley High School, and Fort Dorchester High School.

While coaching at Kingstree High School, Coach Cantrell had success on the football field as an assistant coach, but was also the Head Boys and Girls track and field coach where the boys track team won the Region Championship in 2008 and had two top 10 finishes as a team finishing 8th in the state in 2008, and finished 5th in the state in 2010. During his time at Kingstree High School, the coaching staff helped send numerous players to play football at the college level. As an offensive coordinator, Coach Cantrell helped Timberland High School win the state championship in football in 2014. As an offensive coordinator at Berkeley High School from 2016-2018, Coach Cantrell helped Berkeley win three straight region championships, and they played for the lower state championship in 2017. During that time at Berkeley, the offense set numerous school records and sent eight offensive players to college.

Coach Cantrell comes to KHS from Fort Dorchester High School, where he was the Quarterbacks Coach the past two seasons. Welcome to Blazer Nation!
