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Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

This week we worked with the numbers 6-9. Each day we work on one number to try to find all of the combinations that equal our number. For example, our number is 8. We work with manipulatives, counters, our fingers, or drawing to find two numbers that equal 8. As some students struggled and others grasped the concept, there were some interesting 'math discussions'.

Students learned the letters d, t, and o. Everyone can recognize the first sound in words. We are still working on middle and last sounds in CVC words.

During circle time students are learning about patterns, months of the year, and counting how many days we have been in school.

Our Explorers had a "rockin" week! We learned about igneous, metamorphic, and sedimentary rocks. We categorized these rocks by property: size, texture, color. Many students ran with the idea of properties and began collecting and sorting leaves. During Explorer time we used some of these samples to do leaf rubbings!

Students also worked with balance scales and were introduced to the term "mass" and the concept of standard measure.

This week has been a very busy week in math for both grades. 3rd graders have just finished their unit on graphing where they learned to interpret and make their own frequency tables, tally charts, pictographs, bar graphs, and line plots! Next week they will begin exploring what it means to multiply. 4th graders have just finished their unit where they learned to multiply large numbers such as 1,387 X 7= and 42 X 89 =. Students will be starting in on learning to do long division next week.
