# School Plan for Shared Student Achievement



### What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Temple Middle will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Temple Middle values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Temple Middle will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school, home, and virtually.

## How is it revised?

Temple Middle School invited all parents to attend our Title I Input meeting on August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at 10:00 AM – 10:30 AM to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the 1% family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year. If the school wide program plan is not satisfactory to the parents of TMS students, parents can submit comments on the plan to the district Title I representative at www.carrollcountyschools.com.

### Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Temple Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children. Parents unable to attend due to transportation or childcare limitations will be provided transportation and childcare if the school is notified of the need.

## Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan will also be posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center, located in the front office.

#### 2021-2022 District Goals

- The percentage of students at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.
- ✓ The percentage of students at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by three percentage points.

#### 2021-2022 School Goals

Temple Middle School will focus on improving student literacy in all grade levels by implementing and carrying out the cross-curricular Wit & Wisdom writing model (SEEC) in all content areas. TMS will focus on improving Math by showing .9 months of growth on the STAR Math. This will be accomplished by improving areas of focus in 6th grade number sense, 7th grade understanding of operations with rational numbers, and 8th grade defining/evaluating/comparing functions.

- Teachers will utilize MobyMax, USA Test Prep, DBQs, TIME for Kids, Gallopade, Social Studies Weekly, NewsELA to improve literacy through remediation and acceleration
- TMS will include weekly ELA full block collaborative planning meetings

## **School-Parent Compacts**

As part of this plan, Temple Middle and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the

Academic Parent Meetings and the Input meetings. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept in the Parent Resource Area if parents need another copy.

    - Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events and post a suggestion form on the school website in order to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.


# Parent and Family Engagement Standards
