

Dear Parishioners,

I take a few minutes away from retreat to write up these notes. I went to bed almost immediately after arriving, as I was both exhausted and not feeling well - my stomach was acting up and I had to stop along the road to tend to it. After 11 hours of sleep, light meals and more naps in between presentations and prayer, I am feeling much better on this Tuesday.

I am appreciative that we are given this time for retreat, though it causes some pain. I have learned the hard way of the necessity of these days. If I don't take a preached retreat or at least a directed retreat (meeting one-on-one with a director daily or more), I do not have a good experience at retreat – I am not nourished at all. The Diocesan priest retreat is wonderful because we usually have great masters, with my brother priests, at a location (Christ the King Retreat Center in Buffalo) that is both lovely and prayerful.

Priest retreats are also unlike what you might imagine. While we take time for Mass, adoration, confession, personal prayer, and meditations, it is the 'in-between time' that helps too. Priests connect with each other, sharing stories of others who have served our diocese. We share the joys and struggles of being pastors or vicars in our diocese. We laugh and hear of the joys and sorrows in our personal lives. We get to know each other, tease each other, just like brothers will. It is a beautiful thing. This year, I have the privilege of sharing in this experience with our three new priests, Fr. Tanner, Fr. Josh, and Fr. Nathan. These days are irreplaceable and so again thank you for being understanding. I hope that elsewhere, we will have the letter from Bishop

Zielinski regarding priest moves. We were asked to read it, but with First Communions on Sunday, it seemed a little much. The moves do not affect us directly. Fr. Brendan Rolling will be moving to Fairfax/Gibbon and be the Director of Vocations, while Fr. Tanner has been appointed assistant director of vocations. Please keep them in prayer for this extremely important ministry – again, see Bishop's letter for a little more background on that.

LITURGY MATTERS #24

The third part of the preface connects with the preceding by always saying, "Therefore..." With this it presents our desire and our request of God that our voices might blend with the voices of all the angels and saints in singing God's praises.

We have stated that the priest leading this prayer images for the assembly the reality of Christ as head of

his praying body. The phrase "through Jesus Christ our Lord" in the preface, as well as the second part which expresses his action on our behalf, give occasion to add a refinement to how we understand this.

Thus, while it is true that the priest is a sacrament of Christ in his role as head, we are not to imagine somehow that he is Christ. He is an image of Christ but at the same time distinguishable from him.

The preface leads up to the *Holy, Holy, Holy,* where we all sing the heavenly hymn that has been revealed to us by several key scriptural texts. These texts unveil for us to some extent the invisible realities into which we are now caught up.

There is first of all the vision of God that the prophet Isaiah had when he was caught up in prayer and, as he says, "I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple." He goes on to describe what he saw: "Seraphim were stationed above; each of them had six wings: with two they veiled their faces, with two they veiled their feet, and with two they hovered aloft." Then he hears them crying aloud to one another: "Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!"

In Revelations, John writes a very similar vision when he is "caught up in ecstasy on the Lord's day" and "writes on a scroll" the visions he sees of the heavenly liturgy. At one point in his vision he sees the very throne of God, surrounded by the same winged creatures that Isaiah had seen. He too gives us the words of their ceaseless hymn. He tells us, "Day and night, without pause, they sang: 'Holy, Holy, Holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was, and who is, and who is to come!"

These visions of the holy prophet and apostle help us to take the measure of all that is happening at Mass when we sing the same words of the angelic song.
