Public Comment:

Eric Cioffi, Principal of Fannin County High School, shared information with the Board regarding the following recent accomplishments of the school:

- 2011 Platinum Award Governor's Office of Student Achievement (Fannin County High School was one of eight schools that received the award);
- AP Challenge Award College Board;
- All 18 participating students placed at the Skills USA Regional Competition (16 First place awards and two third place awards);
- Five awards were received at the Mock Trial competition; and
- Sally Jones was the District Winner for the Daughters of the American Revolution Good Citizen Award only four in the state (the final winner will be determined at a later date).

Mr. Cioffi also presented the Board and Superintendent with "Elite 8" t-shirts, which all students and staff at the high school will receive in recognition of Platinum Award. Mr. Cioffi stated the t-shirts were made possible by donations from Jostens and the Fannin County Academic Booster Club.

After public comment, moved, seconded, and carried to approve the financial report for the month ending December 31, 2011. Mark Henson, Superintendent, stated the SPLOST check received in January for the month of November was \$333,044.40.

Art Hubbard, Assistant Superintendent, gave Board members an update on the ongoing construction projects. Mr. Hubbard stated the following items were completed on the field house project: 1) the interior plumbing rough work has been completed; 2) the exterior masonry work is complete; 3) the interior masonry work is 95% complete; 4) the HVAC ductwork installation is complete; 5) weatherproofing is 95% complete; 6) the interior electrical rough is 60% complete; 7) locker pads are poured in the varsity locker room; and 8) the door frames are installed.

Mr. Hubbard stated paving of the baseball parking area was underway, and the re-contouring and seeding of the drainage area was complete.

Karen Walton, Director of Curriculum and School Improvement, reviewed the current Board Code of Ethics Policy BH and the Board Member Conflict of Interest Policy BHA with board members. Mrs. Walton stated the purpose of this review was to ensure the Board is in compliance with the mandate issued by the Georgia Department of Education regarding local board training.

Dr. Michael Gwatney, Director of Technology & Media Services, reviewed with the Board the current Internet Acceptable Use Policy. Due to a recent order from the FCC, school districts receiving e-rate funds must have an Internet safety policy in place that provides for the education of students regarding appropriate online behavior. The change is an addition to the existing federal requirement that school districts monitor online activity.

Superintendent's Comments:

Mr. Henson congratulated the high school for all the accolades. Mr. Henson stated he was very proud of their latest achievement, the AP Challenge award. Mr. Henson stated this award was issued by the College Board for schools of 900 or fewer students with students testing in four of the core areas (English, math, science, and social studies).

Mr. Henson thanked Dr. Gwatney and his staff for their help with the transition from laptop computers to iPads for use during meetings. He said the transition was very smooth, and the iPads were better suited to the needs of the Board and more economical compared to a laptop.

Mr. Henson stated if other school systems around the state had board members as ethical as our Board members, then there would be no need for school systems to have a code of ethics and conflict of interest policy in place.

Mr. Henson reminded the Board about the 2012 GSBA/GSSA Ninth District visit to the Georgia Capitol on Tuesday, February 28.

Mr. Henson also reminded Board members of the 2012 GSBA summer conference and delegate assembly to be held in Savannah, GA, at the Hyatt Regency Hotel on Friday, June 15, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Saturday, June 16, from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.

Mr. Henson stated there had been a conflict in the previous date set for the strategic planning session on February 14, and Mr. Henson asked for alternate dates. All members agreed to hold the session on Friday, March 2nd. Mr. Henson stated breakfast would be at 7:30 a.m. at the central office, and the planning session would be 8:00 a.m. to noon.

Mr. Henson asked Susan Jackson, Director of Finance, to present the Board members with a summary of the State Health Benefit Plan changes that are being implemented.

Board Members' Comments:

Terry Bramlett stated it was a honor to be a part of the Fannin County Board of Education. Mr. Bramlett expressed his appreciation to his fellow board members for their understanding of missing the Tuesday work session while he was in Dallas, Texas, working with the Boy Scouts of America. Mr. Bramlett stated he is excited about the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) initiative the Boy Scouts are rolling out and how it partners with education. Mr. Bramlett also stated he appreciated Dr. Gwatney moving forward with technology for Fannin County Schools. Mr. Bramlett stated it was convenient to be able to follow the meeting information online via his computer or phone while he was out of town.

Lewis DeWeese stated it was a very good meeting.

Steve Stanley congratulated Eric Cioffi for the many accomplishments at the high school during his tenure as principal.

Sandra Mercier congratulated the following system-wide winners on behalf of all board members:
