




Demonstrate a positive attitude about school to your children. Monitor your child's television, video game, and Internet use. Encourage your child to look at books, read to them or with them. Talk with your child and allow them to ask you questions. Example "What is one thing new you learned today?" Add to their learning by helping with letter recognition and sounds. My goal is that every student feels comfortable to visit the nurse for all illness and injuries or just a little TLC. Sometimes a little ice pack, a snack and a quiet break are the best cures. I love working with your children and will keep you informed of any health needs/issues with your child. If your child has any issues that may interfere with their learning, such as <u>lactose intolerance, urinary/bowel</u> please contact me directly so understand your child's requirements and ensure we are meeting those needs.

Keeping your students' emergency information up to date is critical. Please be sure to notify the school office with all changes in cell/home phone numbers. If your child takes any medication, including inhalers for asthma, that you would like them to have at school, I need to have a written order from your child's doctor. I look forward to working with you and your child through the 2022-2023 school year.
