Academic Search Premier

Curates and indexes open access journals. Academic Search Premier content includes: 2,258 full-text, non-open journals; 1,955 active full-text, peer-reviewed, non-open access journals; 512 active full-text, peer-reviewed, non-open access to journals with no embargo; 1,785 active full-text, non-open access journals indexed in Web of Science or Scopus; 75,000 videos from the Associated Press that is updated monthly; Covers topics such as Biology, Chemistry, Engineering, Psychology, and more.

Book Collection: Nonfiction (EBSCO)

A cross-curricular database, designed for public libraries, that provides abstracts and searchable full-text for thousands of popular nonfiction books. Book Collection: Nonfiction content includes: 4,300 nonfiction books with abstracts and searchable full text; and Popular series from book publishers such as Allosaurus Publishers, Capstone Press, Fulcrum Publishing, Morgan Reynolds, Inc., and more.

Britannica Academic

Britannica Academic is designed for college and university libraries and provides access to comprehensive information, as well as the combination of Encyclopedia Britannica plus Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary and Thesaurus. Britannica Academic content includes: 106,617 articles; 58,621 photos; 3,857 videos; 554 magazines and journals; 34,046 eBooks.

Capstone Interactive (Capstone e-Books)

A collection of 237 eBooks for PreK, Grades K-6, and early readers. Capstone eBooks content includes eBooks in both English and Spanish; Book search; Audio narration; Text highlighting to match audio narration; eBooks on adventure stories, superheroes, sports, dinosaurs, animals, origami, and more.

ERIC (EBSCO)

ERIC (Education Resources Information Center) is a database of indexed and full-text education literature resources. ERIC content includes: Over 1.6 million records; Links to over 750,000 full-text documents; Access to an education-specific thesaurus that contains over 11,700 terms; and Coverage that dates back to 1907.

EBSCO Discovery Service College and University (EBSCO)

EBSCO Discovery Service provides single search access to a majority of AVL resources. Through the EBSCO Discovery Service users can: Search EBSCO databases and its partner databases and Access eBooks, magazines, and full-text articles.

EBSCOhost Search (EBSCO)

An online research platform that provides access to EBSCO databases and search features that are utilized by researchers. Through EBSCOhost users can Search databases and refine search results and Access text-to-speech for HTML articles, ARIA landmarks and more.

Gale E-books (Gale)

A collection of e-books that covers a multitude of subjects including early learning, history, education, business, science, arts, and more.

Gale General OneFile

Provides access to magazine, news, and journal articles on general interest topics and currents events. Content includes: Publication Search and Browsing by topic including Careers, Education, Health, and more.

Gale Power Search (Gale)

Gale Power Search provides simultaneous searching across a variety of Gale databases including Gale General OneFile; Gale Literature; Gale in Context; Gale eBooks and more.

MasterFILE Premier (EBSCO)

Designed for public libraries and provides a collection of full-text magazines, e-books, and primary source documents. Content includes 1,579 full-text magazines and journals and 55,000 full-text primary source documents.

MasterFILE Reference eBook Collection

A complimentary reference eBook collection for MasterFILE Premier. MasterFILE Reference eBook Collection contains nonfiction and reference books from top educational publishers and dozens of university presses.

PebbleGo Animals and Science (Capstone)

Provides K-3 students with access to interactive articles on animals and science. PebbleGo Animals & Science content includes Text appropriate for K-3 readers; 505 Animal articles; 263 Science articles; Read aloud technology; 508 Compliant and WCAG 2.1 AA rated for accessibility.

PBS LearningMedia (Alabama Public Television)

An online database that provides access to thousands of resources from PBS stations and content partners. Teacher Reference Center

Teaching Books (for Schools)

A PreK-12 reading and library service that creates connections to the books that people are reading. TeachingBooks content includes Search for resources about a book; Meet-the-Author interviews; Read-along book recordings; Literature based vocabulary lists; Available in 104 languages.

Teaching Books for Libraries

TeachingBooks for Libraries is a separate interface from TeachingBooks and is designed to meet the needs of public libraries. TeachingBooks for Libraries content includes: 1,903 complete book readings; 15,735 read-along audiobook performances; Support assignments on books and authors; and Library Programming, Diverse Books Toolkit, Homeschool Support and more.

Alexander Street

Provides a vast database of film and video clips from documentaries, newsreel, entertainment, and television sources. The streaming video, audio, and text *library* databases promotes research, teaching, and learning across disciplines, including counseling, anthropology, history, diversity studies, theatre, film, music, dance, news, current affairs, and the social sciences. The range of material is broad and deep. The thematic range and temporal span make the collection relevant to many disciplines, courses, and student levels.

Book Collection: Nonfiction

Cross-curricular database providing abstracts and searchable full text for thousands of popular nonfiction books. Designed for public libraries, it covers core subject areas as well as information on careers, health, sports, adventure, technology, life skills and more.

Oxford Academic (Oxford University Press)

Provides perpetual access to books spanning the scholarly list of Oxford University Press. To find the online books that are included in the AVL subscription with Oxford Academic, users will need to enter a subject in the search box and when the results come up, users will need to click on **Unlocked Free**, and **Open Access** in the "Narrow Your Choices" box on the left.

Oxford Reference (Oxford University Press) (https://www.oxfordreference.com/)

Provides access to Oxford University Press's *Encyclopedias* and *Companions*, and a selection of partner publishers' scholarly works. Oxford Reference content includes: 466 books; 2,279,165 entries; New titles and editions are added throughout the year; Subjects include Art and Architecture, History, Law, Philosophy, Religion, Science and Technology, and more.
