What is Critical Race Theory?

“Critical race theory is a way of thinking about America’s history through the lens of racism. Scholars developed it during the 1970’s and 1980’s in response to what they viewed as a lack of racial progress following the civil rights legislation of the 1960’s.” - AP News

The Law:

[House Bill 1775](#) prohibits public school and universities from teaching the “one race or sex is inherently superior to another,” and that “an individual, by virtue of this or her race or sex, is inherently racist, sexist or oppressive.”
