

John DeAngelo is a 1960 graduate of PHS. He was awarded a Bachelor of Arts degree from LaSalle College in History with a minor in English in 1964. He attended Rutgers University and Glassboro State College to take courses toward certification in secondary school English, which he acquired in 1971. In 1972 he earned a Master's Degree in Educational Media from Temple University.

John taught English at Gloucester Catholic High School and Triton Regional High School before becoming the Director of Learning Resources at the College of HPERD (Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance) at Temple University (1972-83). He subsequently became the Assistant to the Dean for Development (1980-83), Assistant Dean (1983-89), and Associate Dean (1989-98). From 1998-2009, John served as Associate Dean for Information Technology in the Fox School of Business at Temple. John was the Assistant Vice Chancellor for Educational Technology Services at the University of California San Francisco until his retirement in 2018.

John was a prolific writer and editor, contributing to technology and business journals throughout his career, as well as authoring proposals and applications for grants. He was also a presenter at various conferences and seminars and the producer of videos which served to recruit students to Temple University and to detail cooperative efforts among Temple, the City of Philadelphia and the NCAA in providing recreational opportunities to disadvantaged children in North Philadelphia.

John was a leader in strategic planning for the Fox School of Business to infuse technology in teaching, learning and administrative processes. He computerized offices for greater productivity, expanded the college's web presence, and introduced online instruction to Fox. He also helped design and implement learning spaces in the Michael Graves-designed Alter Hall.

John was honored by having an award at the Fox Business School named after him: the "Innovative Use of Technology Award." He received many awards for his work, including Premier 100 IT Leader from Computerworld Magazine and was a finalist for the Wharton/Infosys Business Transformation Award. He received the President's Award, HPERD Alumni Association twice and the Layman Honor Award from the Pennsylvania Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance.

John was the President of the Waterford Library Board of Trustees and a volunteer for the Camden County Library, Winslow Branch. For his civic endeavors he was the recipient of the Mayor's Award for Outstanding Service in Waterford Township.

John currently resides in Alamo, California with his wife Judy. They have one child, Adrienne.
