Our Annual Parent Meeting was held at Goshen High School on August 23rd at 5:30. Parents from GES and GES were in attendance. Parents were provided with a video and information on how Title I funds are utilized within the school. It was emphasized that parents play a key part in developing and analyzing the plan and implementation. Additionally, that it is each parent's right to be involved in the process.

We have various committees and opportunities for parents to be involved in planning and support of GES. Parents volunteer for special events, serve as committee members, provide feedback through surveys and questionnaires and PTO meetings.

Parents attend PTO meetings and other on campus events. Parents communicate with teachers at least weekly and in most grade levels through home-school folders and Remind.

GES spends parent involvement/engagement funds on home to school communicator folders, stamps, school calendars, supplies, books, flashcards, and other instructional supplies and materials for use at home

Parents receive daily and/or weekly communications regarding their children. A yearly calendar of events is sent home at the beginning of the year from the district, and each school within the district

follows up with reminders each month. The calendar is also posted on our website and Facebook page. Parents are given school handbooks which provide pertinent information related to academics and behavior about GES. Parents are informed via website postings, Facebook, Remind and/or notes sent home.

GES has a School-Parent Compact that has been developed and updated by a committee of teachers, parents, and administrators. Parents are the key to assist with a gain in academic and behavior goals.
