

## Aimsweb Plus Individual Benchmark Report Guide for Parents

### Understanding the Individual Benchmark Report

The Individual Benchmark Report is a helpful tool we use to track your child's progress in school. Here is a quick guide to what the report shows:

- Overall Performance: It displays how your child is doing in specific areas like reading or math. - Comparison: You can see your child's scores compared to national averages or other students in their grade.
- Growth Over Time: The report often includes data from the current year and previous years to show how much they have improved.
- Target Goals: It may show a "Target Line" to help us see if your child is on track to meet their end-of-year goals.

### Understanding the Data Tables

At the bottom of your report, you will find tables that break down the numbers:

- Performance Table: This provides the specific National Percentile and Performance Level (such as "Above Average" or "Below Average") for each testing period (Fall, Winter, Spring). This helps you see exactly where your child stands compared to their peers nationwide.
- Rate of Improvement (ROI) Table: This measures how much your child has learned between testing periods. It compares your child's actual growth to the "Typical" or "Target" growth for students in the same grade.
- Student Growth Percentile (SGP): Often included in these tables, the SGP compares your child's growth to other students who started with similar scores.
- Lexile level: In the aimswebPlus system, Lexile measures are generated from: Oral Reading Fluency (ORF) for Grade 1 and Reading Comprehension (RC) for Grades 2 through 12.
