RANDOLPH COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT GOALS:

- The percentage of students scoring at Proficient Learners or above on the Georgia Milestones (GAMS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by five percentage points.
- The percentage of students scoring at Proficient Learners or above on the Georgia Milestones (GAMS) Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by five percentage points.

RANDOLPH COUNTY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL GOALS:

- RCES will increase the number of proficient learners by 5% on the Reading/ELA section on the spring administration of the 2024 GMAS end of grade assessment.
- RCES will increase the number of proficient learners by 5% on the mathematics section on the spring administration of the 2024 GMAS end of grade assessment.

- See that all homework/classwork assignments are completed;
- Communicate regularly with my child's teachers;
- Talk with my child about his/her school activities daily;
- Volunteer my time at my child's school as an active parent.

- Read books and the newspaper on a daily basis by using reading comprehension strategies;
- Practice math fluency with a family member;
- Set goals and develop strategies to achieve them;
