> Corty-eight teachers participated in the fourth session of the Special Education Teacher Induction on November 8th. Dr. Karen Jones, Mrs. Daphne Whetsel, and Mrs. Cindy Harkins focused on "High Leverage Practices for Inclusive Classrooms", in the first of this two part series. Participants learned fundamental practices for supporting student learning. Topics included practices in collaboration, assessment, social/emotional behavior, and instructional strategies. Teachers engaged in vital conversations regarding evidence based practices, completed self-assessments, and participated in case study reviews to demonstrate understanding. Resources from this learning session, as well as additional professional development materials, were shared with participants through Google Classroom.

The Autism and Behavior Intervention Team have distributed Zones of Regulation materials throughout our district this school year. Zones of Regulation is a cognitive behavioral approach to teaching self-regulation and emotional control that is based on immense evidence in the fields of autism spectrum disorders (ASD), attention deficit disorders (ADD/HD) and social-emotional theories. The goal is to provide our students with a thinking framework, a way to nurture their development, and create a consistent language for staff and students across all settings. The team provided two training opportunities after school on October 25th and 27th for teachers to obtain more information on how to implement the approach and offered examples of supplemental resources to aid in implementation. There were approximately 40 special education teachers in attendance at both trainings. We would like to send a special thank you to Houston County High School and David Perdue Primary School for hosting this training.

Houston County's own Dr. Steven Hornyak, Monica Smith, and Tangela Brice had the honor to present on *Preventing Fires: Moving Away from Wait-to-Fail Approaches.* This presentation explored the proactive approaches the Houston County School District is utilizing for behavioral interventions. The focus was on The Student Risk Screening Scale-Internalizing and Externalizing (SRSS-IE) which is a universal behavior screening tool completed by teachers. Behavior screeners are a proactive way for teachers to identify behaviors in the classroom that may be obstacles to learning. The audience explored ways to interpret screener results and how to use the data to implement interventions. We are proud our district was represented at G-CASE!
