**PROCEEDINGS OF ANNUAL SCHOOL
MEETING OF DIST. NO. 5 FR'L
FAIR HAVEN TOWNSHIP.**

Annual school meeting of Dist. No. 5 fr'l, Fairhaven township was held at this school house of said district on Monday, July 12, 1920 at 8 o'clock p. m.

The meeting was called to order by the chairman Carl Marotzke.

The last year's minutes were read and approved as read.

The annual financial report was read by the director and accepted as read.

Election of officers by ballot. John Faist and C. B. Otto were appointed as tellers. The term of Carl Marotzke and Charles W. Gettel had expired.

The first ballot taken resulted in the election of Edward Gettel as a member of school board, full term.

The second ballot for the second member resulted to the election of C. B. Otto as a member of school board, full term. Mr. C. B. Otto refused or declined to accept the office and on motion declared excused.

A third ballot was taken which resulted to the election of Walter Bueschlen for the second member of school board, full term.

The buying of wood was left in care of the school board.

Job to furnish 3 cords of kindling wood was sold to Harold Oeschger for \$5.25 per cord.

Job to haul about 5 tons of soft coal from J. C. Liken & Co., Sebewaing before Oct. 1st, 1920 was sold to Christ Brown for \$1.90 per ton.

It was voted to have 9 months school for the ensuing term.

It was also carried to have 3 weeks beet vacation in October.

Job cleaning school twice, once before Aug. 10, 1920 and again between Christmas and New Year's, same year

according to specification mentioned was sold to Chas. W. Gettel for \$41. Window lights were left same as before. Children that break windows must pay and replace same again.

Job to oil floors twice after cleaning school was sold to William Gettel for \$6.00.

Mowing school yard was left in care of school board.

Job cleaning and washing out outhouses was sold to William Gettel for \$5.00.

It was voted that the school should begin Aug. 23, 1920.

No further business.

On motion adjourned for one year at 8 o'clock p. m.
