Note to Enumerators - The census list must be sworn to, to entitle the district to public money. Enumerators shall not include in the census the names of any child or children in institutions or prisons, nor the names of any child or children in orphan, almshouse, or other charitable institutions, except as follows: 1. Children in such institutions who regularly attend the public schools. 2. Children in such institutions who are provided for according to law (27 and 28). If you do not have them, need for them. 3. Children of other than their parents, except children in such institutions in which the parents, or either of them, reside in such city or township and in such cases the legal residence of the child is that of the parent. 4. Children, full born, and other persons if included in the census, must be recorded at the residence of their parents or legal guardians. Indian children shall not be included in any census unless they attend the public schools, or those persons who provide for children in almshouses, except where they do not attend schools of the district. 5. A child resident from the district during the twenty days preceding June 1, but not included in the census in which he is named May 31, 1920, cannot be taken a house to house canvass thereafter the census, and his name shall be put in primary history for the year. It should be noted in the census in which he is named May 31, 1920.
