Review of Minutes - Needed to review January and February Minutes due to the attendance.

#### Administrative Report- Mrs. Griffiths

- \* We had a successful FTE in February. Our student count calculated to 447. We had over 30 acceptance letters mailed out and our PreK unit is at 17 for the 23/24 school year.
- \* Our literacy week was a success! We had our students do the following:
- K-2: Students made habitat bags and filled them with facts about sea creatures from non-fiction books.
- 3rd: Students did a book tasting of the books that are apart of the Florida Standards
- $4^{\text{th}}/5^{\text{th}}$ : Our fourth-grade students did biography bags while our fifth graders read about volcanoes and recreated them.
- \* Our PYP Committee wanted to close out the year with an IB family night. Therefore we decided to add a culture night onto our calendar in the month of April.
- \* Teachers have started a Google Classroom that is dedicated to professional development. The consultant recommended that we read specific articles. The teachers will read their articles and write a reflection. This information will be used with the authorization team next year as we continue our journey with authorization.
- \* Mrs. Alexander has started Wida testing with a team of teachers as we have 97 ELL students K-5.
- \* Tutoring will begin on February 13th and go through the third week of April. We are very appreciative of staff and the work they do as they are going above and beyond. We appreciate the support of our parents for the transportation and pick up from after school.
- \* Our first graders did amazing with their performance! We are super proud of them!
- \* FDLRS is a wonderful resource and they are providing professional development to our ESE department and will be working with us to develop a stronger master schedule and have a more effective way of scheduling our ESE teachers.
- \* Mrs. Alexander has been working hard to create a mentor group for our students. We also have community members come in and speak to our fourth and fifth grade students every Friday morning. We are thankful for the community support!
