## **KERR COUNTY CHILD SERVICES BOARD**

To meet the critical needs of abused and neglected children. We work with CPS case workers on a “case-by-case” basis to encourage and support relative and/or kinship placements. We provide assistance with foster care licensing fees, furniture and other items necessary to have a child placed with a relative or kinship placement. We encourage foster children by assisting with extracurricular activities, graduation expenses and summer camps. We help with Christmas gifts for foster children and back-to-school items. We maintain the “Rainbow Room” at CPS where we provide clothes, diapers, formula, etc. for children taken into care. We have a backpack program where CPS case workers can pack a bag for a child when they are taken into care. We also reimburse CPS case workers for items they purchase for a child in care. We provide essential items to the CPS office, such as tissues, diapers, wipes, hand sanitizer, bottled water and snacks.
