I. Introduction:

Narrative description of the school, the community, and the educational programs

Wanatah Public School is a community of approximately 260 students in preschool through grade eight from Cass, Dewey, and Prairie Townships in Southern LaPorte County as well as surrounding areas. Wanatah Public School is located in a rural, agricultural area, which includes the towns of LaCrosse and Wanatah. Wanatah Public School is now part of Tri-Township Consolidated School Corporation, formed in 2012. This consolidation includes Prairie and Dewey Townships of LaPorte County. This corporation is under the supervision of Superintendent M. Kelly Shepherd.

The community has seen significant mobility. The number of homes in our community has increased. There is a significant religious influence with many churches of various denominations located within our attendance area. Most of the parents are employed in skilled and semi-skilled occupations in nearby cities and urban centers. We have 37% of our students receiving free lunches and 10% receiving reduced-price lunches.

The school building was built in 1961 with a million-dollar renovation completed in 1982. The building houses both the elementary and middle school students. In 1999, a 1.2 million-dollar addition/renovation was finalized. In 2001, air conditioning was added to the remaining classrooms that did not have it; two computer laboratories, a science laboratory, art and music rooms, and four new elementary classrooms were added. A new "Benchmark Boilers" system was added in the fall of 2007 and an updated playground with safety equipment was established in 2006. During the summer of 2015, we renovated the Administration Office and added a conference room as well. The largest change is that all students grades K-8 are now 1:1 with Chromebooks. In September of 2021, we started construction on a 5 classroom addition plus remodeling of three classrooms that will allow us to move our high school to Wanatah.

The school is especially fortunate to have many excellent teachers who have always placed a strong emphasis on academic excellence. As a result, our school has been awarded numerous Indiana School Incentive Award Grants based on attendance and achievement scores. Scholastic achievement is supported by student participation in co-curricular activities such as Read-a-Thon, Gifted and Talented Programs for all grades, Student Council, Spell Bowl, the County Spelling Bee, Academic Olympics, Academic Super Bowl, Enrichment Classes, and Accelerated Reader Program.

A full time counselor and a full time nurse are providing support services to the student body. The full time counselor also presents Anti-Bullying lessons regularly to all students. We also offer after-school child care on-site.

Contributing significantly to the students' success are athletics, music, and art programs. Together they provide extra-curricular experiences for the majority of our students in grades K-8.

Our parents are particularly important as they provide a very supportive link in the school's programs. In addition to attending meetings on educational issues, their input has been essential in assuring the success of fund-raising projects and in volunteering for many other school activities.

In addition to the regular school year curriculum, we have in-school and after-school remediation programs. This teacher-led remediation program focuses on grade-level standards. We have also incorporated an RTI program.

• Curriculum

Wanatah Public School Curriculum is closely aligned with the Indiana College and Career Ready Standards adopted by the Indiana State Board of Education. Teachers at Wanatah, under the direction of the building principal, provide enrichment and regular differentiation of the curriculum with various educational activities throughout the year.

Copies of grade-level curriculum are found in each classroom. We also have worked on mapping the curriculum for grades K-8 for Language Arts and Math.

Assessments

Wanatah Public School will administer ILEARN to students in grades 3-8 in the Spring. On file, we have comparison charts for ISTEP+ over the past three years for each student. These charts and our collected data from NWEA's MAP Assessment help us to determine our weaknesses and strengths

Our standardized formative assessment in grades K-8 is NWEA's MAP Assessment. Star Reading is also administered to all students in grades K-8. In addition to this, IREAD is given to Grade 3.

Benchmark unit reading tests are administered to students after completion of each reading unit (McGraw-Hill/Wonders). These tests serve both an evaluation purpose and as a diagnostic tool for progress monitoring of the students. The purpose of testing at Wanatah Public School is primarily formative in nature, and it is used to support instruction.

Star Reading is used as a reading progress assessment tool for our K-8 students. Accelerated Reader is a formative assessment tool used to monitor student progress in grades first through eighth.

WIDA ACCESS is an assessment given to all English/Language Learners.

The Inview Assessment is given to all 2nd, 5th and 8th grade students in order to identify high ability students. The CogAT Assessment Screener is given to all Kindergarten students in order to identify high ability students as well.

E. Technology as a Learning Tool:

Technology is used as a learning tool both in elementary and the middle school. Wanatah Public School has one computer MacBook cart that is used in Middle School Digital Art. All grades K-8 students are 1-1 with Chromebooks. Our school has a Smart Board in every core curriculum classroom with a laptop for every classroom teacher. Classrooms also have document cameras. All students have multiple opportunities to use technology as a learning tool in order to enrich their learning and build their technology skills. Both elementary and middle schools use Educational Apps, Google Classroom and the Internet as a resource tool for major projects.

VI. Specific areas where improvement is needed immediately:

Wanatah School is working to improve their standardized testing scores in math, language arts, science and social studies as well as meet all of the state proficiencies. This effort includes specific Professional Development for ILEARN preparation for teachers. MAP Assessment testing data is systematically reviewed by classroom teachers, special education personnel, the Title 1 teacher, and our High Ability teacher. Online remediation resources as well as teacher-created resources are used.

VII. Benchmarks for progress that specify how and to what extent the school expects to continue improvement in all areas of the education system:

Within three years, Wanatah Public School students will improve ILEARN scores in the area of Language Arts to 70% of all students passing.

Within three years, Wanatah Public School students will improve ILEARN scores in the area of Math at 70% of all students passing.

This year, we have made major progress because we are above state averages in all Science and Social Studies test passing rates as well as many of ELA and Math state averages. Our goal is to experience growth in our scores, so they are **all** above state averages again. Wanatah Public School faculty will encompass the skills of Language Arts and Math across the grade levels through a united, enthusiastic, and dedicated team to approach maximum performance from both students and faculty.
