The Houston College and Career Academy Teaching As a Profession (TAAP) students participated in the Georgia Future Educators Signing Day on May 2, 2023. Students from all five of the Houston County School District's high schools participate in TAAP. The students learn the basics of teaching in the classes "Examining the Teaching Profession" and "Contemporary Issues in Education." They explore the qualities of an effective teacher, writing lesson plans, and classroom management just to name a few. Students also intern one morning per week in the spring at Shirley Hills Elementary or Russell Elementary to give them a

Students wanting to participate in the internship can apply for it in the second year of TAAP. This is a year-long practicum experience in a host classroom where students spend the last two class periods of their day working directly with students, leading whole class lessons, assisting in small groups or one-on-one, grading papers, helping with interventions, and so much more.

During their internship, students can apply for positions in the Youth Apprenticeship Program (YAP) led by Sandi Couillard, YAP Coordinator. Interns earn a paycheck from the Houston County School District for their time working in their host classroom.

Interns also take an End-of-Pathway Assessment (NOCTI). Upon successful completion of the TAAP course work, internship, and a passing score on their EOPA, students earn credit for their first education class (EDUC 2110). This is accepted at any college or university in Georgia which gives them a jump-start on their journey into teaching.

These students received a certificate, a medal, an honor cord for graduation, and a letter of college credit. The interns had over 200 hours of classroom experience. Those that were in TAAP/YAP for three years have over 400 hours.



Dr. Cheronie Blunt Selected as the 2023 GACTE Post-Secondary Professional of the Year



Dr. Cheronie Blunt, recently retired educator, was a Central Georgia Technical dual enrollment instructor at the Houston College and Career Academy in the Criminal Justice Program for many years. She was the nominee for the Georgia Council for Career and Technical Administrators (GCCTA), a division of the Georgia Association for Career and Technical Education (GACTE). She was named the GCCTA Post-Secondary Professional of the Year and competed with the other 12 divisions' nominees at the GACTE Awards Program. The event was held Thursday, June 15, 2023, and Dr. Blunt was named the 2023 GACTE Post-Secondary Professional of the Year.

GACTE is a state affiliate of the national Association for Career and Technical Education (ACTE) organization. GACTE encourages and organizes teachers to become a part of a collective voice that can influence issues and policies that impact career, technical, and agricultural education (CTAE). As a member, teachers can network with each other and gain important and helpful tips and techniques as well as participate in professional development at local, state, and national levels.

While working full time with the Georgia Department of Corrections (1994 – 2011), she began teaching as an adjunct instructor with Middle Georgia Technical College in 2002 until 2005. She worked with Columbus State University as an adjunct instructor from 2005 – 2008. She started full-time employment with Middle Georgia Technical College, now Central Georgia Technical College in January 2012 with the Public Safety and Professional Services Division. Outside of CGTC, she serves as Manuscript reviewer for the Criminal Justice Association of Georgia for potential scholar articles for *The Pursuit Journal*.

She was the 2018-2019 Teacher of the Year for the Houston County Career Academy and the District Exceptional Teacher of the Year. She has served as the lead teacher for several projects including SkillsUSA, Harbor Freight Grant Writing Committee, and Partners Club. She served as the SkillsUSA adviser for the 2019-2020 State Vice President and one of her students was named the 2020-2021 Lieutenant Governor's College and Career Academy Student of the Year for the State of Georgia. She is also a former recipient of the 2013-2014 CGTC innovation mini-grant and the first dual enrollment instructor to have a "Georgia Occupational Award Leadership" (GOAL) student finalist and 2022 "Rick Perkins Teacher of the Year" Nominee. In 2021, Dr. Blunt served on the TCSG-GaDOE curriculum alignment review team for Criminal Justice courses. She also works with the Georgia Bar Association and three volunteer attorneys to provide Houston County students the opportunity to participate in the Georgia Mock Trial Competitions. "This has greatly prepared me to understand and relay the importance of quality education at all levels and to be a vessel in the community for growing our own leaders," said Dr. Blunt.

Dr. Blunt firmly believes that it is important for students who plan a career with the criminal justice system to learn to appreciate, value and understand all people. She plays a vital role in the recruitment of criminal justice business partners and provides engaging opportunities for the partners to participate in classroom projects. Partners serve as guest speakers and provide field trips opportunities for the students.

HCCA Automotive Students Earn Automotive Service Excellence Certification

The Houston College and Career Academy's Automotive Program is a two-year pathway, and it is designed for students who wish to pursue a career or learn about automobile maintenance and light repair, electrical fundamentals, steering and suspension and brakes.

Thirty-five students were enrolled in the program for the 2022-2023 school year. Upon completion, students can take the Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) Certification Assessment, earn Technical Certificates of Credit (TCC) in Electrical/Electronic Systems and Chassis, as well as earn 20 Dual Enrollment (college credit) hours from Central Georgia Technical College.

The students took the ASE Certification assessment and earned the following:

- Brandon Edmonson, a junior from Houston County High School, completed two years of automotive, and received his ASE Certification in Brakes, Steering, and Suspension. Brandon is currently employed with Five-Star Ford.
- Richard Cross Wasden, a senior from Warner Robins High School, completed two years of automotive, earned ASE Certification in Brakes, and received three TCC from CGTC. He worked at Blue Bird, Inc. over the summer.
- Hsaw Reh, a senior from Warner Robins High School, completed two years of automotive, earned ASE Certification in Brakes, Steering, and Suspension and is now employed with Five-Star Ford.
- Gabriel Calloway, a junior from Perry High School, completed two years of automotive, received all three TCC from CGTC and is currently employed in the automotive industry.
- Robert Moorehead, a senior from Veterans High School, completed two years of automotive and received three TCC and two ASE. He is pursuing his associate degree at CGTC.



At the heart of the conference were the highly anticipated Students Taking Action with Recognition (STAR) Events. Over





In July, Northside Middle School FFA Officers attended Chapter Officer Leadership Training (COLT) at Camp John Hope for three days in Fort Valley, Georgia. COLT focuses on helping chapter officers understand their role and feel motivated to take opportunities that come their way while serving as an officer. COLT also serves to prepare officers to work more closely as a team, stretch their comfort zone, plan for chapter events, and engage with other chapter officers from across the state. NMS FFA Named National Three Star Chapter for 5th Consecutive Year

Northside Middle School FFA was recognized as a National 3 Star, or Gold Emblem, Chapter for the fifth year in a row. This recognition is awarded based on the National Chapter Award Program, which is designed to recognize FFA chapters that actively implement the mission and strategies of the organization. These chapters improve chapter operations using the National Quality Chapter and a Program of Activities that emphasize growing leaders, building communities, and strengthening agriculture. Chapters are rewarded for providing educational experiences for the entire membership.



In order to qualify for a state or national award, an FFA chapter must complete at least 15 activities,

one for each of the five quality standards in each of the three divisions.
