In March, several of our St. Catherine teachers were recognized at the Diocesan 2023 STREAM Symposium. Mrs. Mary Alexander, our Art and Technology Teacher, received the Blue Apple Award for her innovation, creativity, and imagination in teaching and instruction. Mrs. Brenda Berryman received the Charitas Award – given to faculty members nominated by their peers for the constant exhibition and embodiment of the Virtue of Charity. Mrs. Berryman was also a presenter at the STREAM Symposium. Her topic, "Integrating a Growth Mindset in the Classroom" discussed the importance of helping students learn resilience and grit, especially when they encounter obstacle and challenges in their educational journey.
