District Goals

- ⇒ The Coffee County School System will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing level or above in English Language Arts on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade (EOG) Assessment.
- ⇒ The Coffee County School System will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Developing level or above in Mathematics on the Georgia Milestones End of Grade (EOG) Assessment.

School Goals (3rd—5th Grade)

- Implement Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework
- 50% of 3rd—5th grade students will score on grade level or higher according to the Reading Inventory, Math Inventory, and /or GMAS.
- 10% of 3rd-5th Grade students will increase in proficient or exemplary learners (Levels 3 & 4) in all subject areas of GMAS, while decreasing Levels 1 & 2.
- 100% of K-5th students will participate in focused activities to increase physical, social emotional and positive behavioral skills affecting academic achievement and physical health.

School/ Teacher Responsibilities (3—5)

Satilla faculty and staff members will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading, writing, math, and behavior. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Increase the number of students scores at the Developing level or above on the ELA and Math portions of the Georgia Milestones.
- Offer free Family Engagement Nights and Activities
- Share learning websites, learning activities, and tools
- Communicate effectively/often with parents/guardians.
- Focus on improving social, emotional, and academic outcomes for all students
- Utilize technology to help close the achievement gap
- Implement/Follow PBIS Framework



Family Responsibilities (3-5)

- Have fun with math, reading and writing. Use websites, learning activities, and tools to explore academics at home.
- Try to attend Family Events or get information from the PTO or my child's teacher if we can't attend.
- Look for the class and school newsletters/ calendars and check out the school website and Facebook.
- Join online/text messaging service to stay connected! (Provide updated phone numbers.)
- Encourage daily reading.
- Help with math fact fluency.
- Participate in activities that promote student's physical, social, and positive behavioral skills.
- Encourage your bulldog to adhere to PBIS (PAWS).

Student Responsibilities (3-5)

Satilla Elementary students join staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and work towards meeting their goals.

- Talk with my family about what I am learning at school.
- Bring home letters and newsletters from school to share with my family.
- Follow PAWS behavior expectations
- Study vocabulary and read nightly.
